 in manner following. That is to say
 First I give and bequeath to my son John
 Chilton one negro woman named Esther
 and her increase from this day also one
 negro boy named Mily also one feather
 bed and furniture to him and his heirs forever
 Then I give and bequeath to my son Peter
 Chilton one negro Girl and her increase
 named Blacey also one negro Boy named
 March also one negro Boy named Henry
 also one negro Girl named Nance
 and one negro boy named Liza and
 one feather bed and furniture to him
 and his heirs forever
 Then I give and bequeath to my son in law
 William Lamb one Dollar to him and his
 heirs forever
 Then I give and bequeath to my Grand
 sons that is to say Benjamin Lamb William Lamb
 Enock Lamb Leason Lamb & Peter Lamb sons
 of William Lamb one Dollar a piece to be paid
 out of my Estate to each of them and their heirs forever
 Then I leave all the rest of my property without
 doubt and without doer after paying my
 Last Debts and funeral Charges to be equally
 divided between my sons John Chilton and
 Peter Chilton to them and their heirs forever
 Lastly I nominate constitute and appoint my
 son John Chilton my sole and sole executor
 to this my Last will and Testament in
 witness whereof I the said Menney Chilton have
 hereunto set my hand and seal this day & date above
 written Signed sealed & attested in presence of
 my Witnesses Saml Dozier Jurat Menney Chilton

The Last will and Testament of
 of Luke Brown was exhibited at August Term 1820
 In the name of God Amen I Luke Brown
 of the County of Currituck and State of North
 Carolina being of sound mind and perfect
 memory Blesed be god for it Do this the
 thirteenth day of January in the Year of
 our Lord one thousand eight Hundred
 and Eighteen make and Publish this my
 Last will and Testament in manner
 following That is to say
 First I give and bequeath to my wife
 Hesier Brown after my deceased all my
 Property that I have after paying all my
 Last Debts during her natural life
 and after her death to Benjamin Gough
 her Son and if he should die without a
 lawful heir it is my will and desire
 that Miles S. Putney should have the same
 for him in his heirs forever and I hereby
 make and ordain my beloved wife
 Hesier Brown executrix to this my Last
 will and Testament in witness whereof
 I the said Luke Brown have to this
 my Last will and testament set my
 hand and seal this day and date
 above written signed sealed Published and
 Declared by the said Luke Brown
 the Testator as his Last will and Testament
 in presence of us
