And lastly I nominate and appoint my son Samuel Salter and my friend Isaac Beasley and Thomas Poyner Executors to this my last Will and Testament revoking all other will or Wills by me made ratifying and confirming this to be my last Will and Testament An witness whereof I have set my hand and seal this 1st day of December 1821

The last Will and Testament of William Beasley deceased Exhibited and proved at Feby, Term, 1822

In the Name of God Amen. I William Beasley of the State of North Carolina and County of Craven being sick and weak but perfect in mind and memory thanks be unto God for it coming unto my mind the mortality of man have a mind to settle my worldly business in manner and form as follows do make this my last will and testament first I give my soul to God who gave it and my body to be buried in a Christian like manner at the discretion of my Executors and worldly goodz in manner and form as follows Item I give and bequeath unto my wife Nancy Beasley one mare by name Geneva one feather bed and furniture choice one cow and calf choice one sow and pigs choice I also lend my negro woman named Sarah

unto my wife during her life and after her death to be equally divided between William Beasley Julia Stone Polly Whithurst Nancy Beasley and Sally Beasley Item I give unto my daughter Betsy White five dollar cash to be paid at the setting of my estate Item I give unto my daughter Sally Russell five dollar cash to be paid at the setting of my estate I leave the North side of my land and plantation wherein I now live to be rented out ten years from this date by my executors and the money arising therefrom to be equally divided between William Beasley, Julia Stone Michael Beasley Polly Whithurst Nancy Beasley and after the term of ten years I give it to my grand son Henry Beasley son of John Beasley in case he should die without a lawful heir lawfully begotten by his body my will is that Henry Beasley his Brother should have it beginning at a cedar stake in edge of a branch a south easterly course from my house running westerly course through the field to a apple tree from thence to a cedar stake near the old house to poor nursery from thence bearing continuing westerly course to pine in the edge of the woods thence by a line of marked trees to the main road then the road being the line a Northwardly course to John Jones' line thence a easterly course down the said line to the branch from thence a southwardly course the branch being the line to the first station Item I give unto my son John Beasley five dollars to be paid out of my movable property to be paid by my Executors at the setting of my estate also I leave him the little place wherein he now lives to stay at the term of ten years if he chooses and if not to be rented out with the rest of the land Item I give and bequeath unto my son Michael Beasley the South side of my land and plantation I now live on beginning the same cedar stake running the same westerly course and bounded by the same trees to the road thence the road being the line to James Snoddy or Charles Lovett's line and thence a easterly course down James Snoddy line to the branch from thence a Northwardly course the branch being the line to the first station to him his heirs Executors administrators and assigns forever Item I give and bequeath unto my son William Beasley the land I bought of Taylor Beasley as it stands bounded to him and his lawful heirs lawfully begotten by his body but in case he should die without a lawful heir lawfully begotten by his body my will is that my son Michael Beasley should have the said Also Item I give and bequeath unto my son Michael Beasley one negro girl named Ann but in case he should die without a lawful heir lawfully begotten by his body my will is that my son William Beasley Sally Russell Julia Stone

Polly Whitehurst Nancy Beasley should have the same negro girl. Item I give and bequeath unto my three daughters Namely Julia Stone Polly Whitehurst Nancy Beasley all the remainder of my property after my just and lawful debts being paid to be sold by my Executors and Equally divided between them and my will is that if either of them should die without a lawful heir lawfully begotten of their body for survivors to inherit the same. Item I give and bequeath unto my daughter Nancy Beasley one negro girl child named Amy In case she should die without lawful heir lawfully begotten of her body my desire is that Sally Ansel William Beasley Julia Stone Polly Whitehurst & Michael Beasley should have the same negro girl — I nominate constitute and appoint my son Malachi Beasley and William Beasley to be my whole sole executors to this my last will and testament I renounce all other former wills by me made in testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal to be affixed this fifteenth day of May in the year of our lord one thousand eight hundred and nineteen

State of North Carolina In the Name of God Amen.

Currituck County September 21st 1821. Edward Holloway of the County aforesaid being
weak in body of sound memory blessed be God do this day make and publish this my
last will and Testament in manner following that is to say first. I give to Jeptha
Holloway after the death of my Father and Mother a certain part or parcel of land
situated on the ²⁰⁰ narrow shore in the County aforesaid beginning and bounded
as following that is to say beginning at William Everington corner at the sound

side thence westwardly with said line to my west line thence southerly
with said line to the to my southwest corner thence eastwardly my said
line to Thomas Griggs heirs land thence Northward with said line to
Harvie Allong heirs land thence eastwardly with said line to the sound
side thence along the sound side Northwardly to the first station to him
and his heirs forever. Item I leave all the residue of my land lying North and
west of the before mentioned tract to be sold and the money arising to be
equally divided between my lawful representatives Item I leave all my stock
consisting of Cattle Hogs and Mogg to be sold as soon as the circumstance of the
case will admit and the money arising to be equally divided between my two sisters
and Iepa that is to say Polly Holloway and Rebekah Holloway and Iepa
Holloway my sisters son Item I leave all my farming utensials and shop too;
of every description to be sold and the money arising to be equally divided
between Polly Holloway Rebekah Holloway and Iepa's Holloway
Item I leave my watch to be sold and the money arising I give to my
Brother John Holloway. Item I give my gun to Jeptha Holloway together
with all my working apparel except my watch which is heretofore
disposed of. Item I leave all the interest ^{they} hold in the old plantation
that is to say the plantation where my Father formerly lived to be equally
divided between Polly Holloway and Rebekah Holloway Item I leave
all the residue of my estate both real and personal I leave to be sold
and after paying my just debt to be delivered to my mother Rebekah
Holloway. Item I leave John Hampton and Enoch Ball the sole
Executors to this my last will and testament in manner and form as
witness my hand and seal the day herefore above written.
