The last Will and Testament of William Brasley deceased Exhibited and proved at Feby, Term, 1822

In the Name of God Amen. I William Brasley of the State of North Carolina
and County of Currituck being sick and weak but perfect in mind and memory
thanks be unto God for it calling unto mind the mortality of man have a mind to settle
my worldly business in manner and form as follows do make this my last will and
testament first I give my soul to God who gave it and my body to be buried in a
Christian like manner at the discretion of my Executors and worldly goods in manner
and form as follows. Item. I give and bequeath unto my wife Nancy Brasley
one mare by name Ginna one feather bed and furniture choice one cow and calf
choice one sow and pigs choice I also lend my negro woman named Dinah

unto my wife during her life and after her death to be equally divided between
William Brasley Julia Jane Polly Whitehurst Nancy Brasley and Sally Brasley
Item I give unto my daughter Betsy White five dollars cash to be paid at the
settling of my estate. Item I give unto my daughter Sally Ansel five dollars cash
to be paid at the settling of my estate. I leave the north side of my land and
plantation whereon I now live to be rented out ten years from this date by my Executors
and the monies arising therefrom to be equally divided between William Brasley
Julia Jane Michael Brasley Polly Whitehurst Nancy Brasley and after
the term of ten years I give it to my grand son Tully Brasley son of John
Brasley in case he should die without a lawful heir lawfully begotten by his body
my will is that Henry Brasley his Brother should have it beginning at a cedar
stake in edge of a branch a south easterly course from my house running
westerly course through the field to a apple tree from thence to a cedar stake near
the old house to post nursery from thence easterly continuing a westerly
course to pine in the edge of the woods thence by a line of marked trees to the main
road then the road being the line a Northwesterly course to John Jones's line
thence a easterly course down the said line to the branch from thence a
Southwesterly course the branch being the line to the first station.
Item. I give unto my son John Brasley five dollars to be paid out of
my movable property to be paid by my Executors at the settling of my
estate also I leave him the little place whereon he now lives to stay
at the term of ten years if he chooses and if not to be rented out with the
rest of the land. Item. I give and bequeath unto my son Nathaniel Brasley the
south side of my land and plantation I now live on beginning the same cedar
stake running the same westerly course and bounded by the same trees
to the road thence the road being the line to James Ansel's or Charles Lovett's
line and thence a easterly course down James Ansel's line to the branch
from thence a Northwesterly course the branch being the line to the first station
I give and bequeath unto my son William Brasley the land I bought of Taylor Brasley as it stands
bounded to him and his lawful heirs lawfully begotten by his body but in
case he should die without a lawful heir lawfully begotten by his body my will
is that my son Michael Brasley should have the said land. Item. I give
and bequeath unto my son Michael Brasley one negro girl named Ann
but in case he should die without a lawful heir lawfully begotten by his
body my will is that my son William Brasley Sally Ansel Julia Jane

 Polly Whitthurst Nancy Beasley should have the same negro girl. Item I give and bequeath unto my three daughters Namely Julia Stone Polly Whitthurst Nancy Beasley all the remainder of my property after my just and lawful debts being paid to be sold by my Executors and Equally divided between them and my will is that if either of them should die without a lawful heir lawfully begotten of their body for surviving to inherit the deeds. Item I give and bequeath unto my daughter Nancy Beasley one negro girl child Named Amy In case she should die without lawful heir lawfully begotten of her body my desire is that Polly Ansel William Beasley Julia Stone Polly Whitthurst & Richard Beasley should have the same negro girl. I Nominate constitute and appoint my son Malachi Beasley and William Beasley to be my whole sole Executors to this my last Will and testament. I renounce all other former wills by me made in Testimony Whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal to be affixed this fifteenth day of May in the year of our lord one thousand eight hundred and nineteen

The last Will and Testament of Edward Holloways deceased
 Exhibited and proved Nov. Term 1821.

State of North Carolina In the name of God Amen.
 Currituck County September 21st 1821. I Edward Holloway of the County aforesaid being
 weak in body of sound memory blessed be God do this day make and publish this my
 last will and Testament in manner following that is to say first. I give to Jesse
 Holloway after the death of my father and Mother a certain part or parcel of land
 situated on the narrow shore in the County aforesaid beginning and bounded
 as follows that is to say beginning at William Everingtons corner at the sound

 side thence westwardly with said line to my west line thence southerly
 with said line to the to my southwest corner thence eastwardly my said
 line to Thomas Griggs heirs land thence Northward with said line to
 Jarvis A. Long heirs land thence eastwardly with said line to the sound
 side thence along the sound side Northwardly to the first station to him
 and his heirs forever. Item I leave all the residue of my land lying North and
 west of the before mentioned tract to be sold and the money arising to be
 equally divided between my lawful representatives Item I leave all my stock
 consisting of Cattle Hogs and Hogs to be sold as soon as the circumstance of the
 case will admit and the money arising to be equally divided between my two sisters
 and Jesse that is to say Polly Holloway and Rebecca Holloway and Jesse
 Holloway my sisters son Item I leave all my farming utensils and shop tools
 of every description to be sold and the money arising to be equally divided
 between Polly Holloway Rebecca Holloway and Jesse S. Holloway
 Item I leave my watch to be sold and the money arising I give to my
 Brother John Holloway. Item I give my gun to Jesse Holloway togeth
 er with all my wearing apparel except my watch which is heretofore
 disposed of. Item I leave all the interest ^{that} I hold in the old plantation
 that is to say the plantation where my Father formerly lived to be equally
 divided between Polly Holloway and Rebecca Holloway Item I leave
 all the residue of my estate both real and personal I leave to be sold
 and after paying my just debts to be delivered to my Mother Rebecca
 Holloway. Item I leave John Hampton and Enoch Ball the sole
 Executors to this my last will and testament in manner and form as
 witness my hand and seal the day heretofore above written.
