so as to include the two Pines Islands So on to the landing  
up the creek to the head then Eastwardly to the first Station.  
And the Proceeds to be appropriated to the use of paying  
My lawful debts, and also as much of my lawful able estate  
As will pay all my lawful debts, such things as my wife  
& family has been off on, I then leave the residue of all  
My estate Real and Personal after my lawful debts, are  
Paid to my well beloved wife Mary Simmons, during her  
widowhood but at her marriage or death then to be  
Paid and the Proceeds to be equally divided between all my  
Children then living that is to say Semantha Simmons  
Sam, Simmons, Will, Simmons, Labb Simmons & Simmons  
And Polly Simmons, reserving and disannulling all other wills & Gifts  
Notifying & Confirming this to be my last will & Testament  
And testifying I appoint my well beloved wife Mary Simmons  
And John Hill my executors of this my last will and  
Testament, In witness hereof I have hereunto set my hand  
and Seal this four day of June one thousand eight hundred  
and five

In the Name of God amon, I William Glasgow of the County of  
Currituck being Very Sick and feeble in Body but of a sound and  
disposing memory think it to God for it, knowing that it is our  
Appointment for all men to die, I then make this my last will and  
Testament. I give to my beloved wife Sarah Glasgow my  
Mare and Riding Horse and harness, one feather bed one linen  
Wool and two Blankets. I do give and bequeath to my son John  
Glasgow the new Poplar field and clearing and lands of 100 acres  
plus of the road. I give and bequeath to my son John  
Glasgow the land lying in the said town that I and William Glasgow  
bought for 1000 dollars and from thence to a branch on  
the north side of the road between said town and main road  
and from thence running in a straight line, as an marked or  
made a line to a branch that stands along the road  
along the former said line that I marked for the said town  
I give to him and his heirs forever.

I give and bequeath to my son Isaac Glasgow the four  
fields and lands of from the living tree to the head of the old  
branch and then down the middle of said branch along  
the plantation to said river I give and bequeath to my son  
William Glasgow a small piece of land beginning at the  
main road upon the line of this road along said line  
at a pine stump at foot of the road lying the same  
course of said line and from width of it from said line  
to said stump into his other land that I gave him which  
contains half the remainder of any land upon this side of the  
road, the north part to him and his heirs forever.

I give and bequeath to my son John F. Glasgow the other part  
of land and plantation and house upon this side of the road  
and all along the said road up to said line to him and his  
heirs forever.

I give to my daughter Ruth Glasgow one feather bed one  
linen sheet and one lawn and a set and one set  
I give to my daughter Ann Wright one feather bed one linen  
sheet and one set that she has received and got in her possession  
and one set and a lamb.

1801. I give to my daughter Sophia Glasgow one fourth part of the  
 Part of my real estate property to be sold and equally divided  
 Between my three Daughters within one year and one half  
 Years next to the day for better more certain and  
 Safe my negro Mary I give to my three daughters Mary  
 Love and Sophia Glasgow. all equal parts.

And I do constitute and appoint Willis Glasgow my whole  
 and sole Executor of this my will with full power  
 Given under my hand and Seal this the 14th day  
 of October 1801.

281. This 12th day of September 1801. My last will and

 to be got up to pay the debt. I leave my wife Susanna

 six chairs I leave one cow and pigs and six hogs to my  
 wife Susanna Well, and I leave my wife Susanna Well  
 eight barrels of Indian corn and the larger part and all  
 the hay and the feather bed and furniture and all the rest  
 of my property to be sold I leave my Susanna Well  
 the Receipts this will serve in my perfect times, the  
 Day and date above written.
