The last will and Testament of Thomas Best deceased Exhibited  
and proved at May term 1818.

In the name of God, Amen. The 18th day,  
Burke County, 3d January 1818. I Thomas Best of Hinnicket Banks  
the county of Burke, being in sound mind and memory, but very sick of  
body, calling upon my mortal soul to witness, I do make and declare for all men  
alive to witness and record, that my last will & Testament, so far as it may be  
concerned, is this, to give my soul into the hand of  
Almighty God, that give it and my body command unto the earth to be  
buried in a Christian like manner, at the discretion of my Executor, nothing  
doubting but at the general resurrection shall receive the same. First of  
all my desire is that all my lawful debts to be paid, and as touching of  
my worldly estate, I give as in manner and form following. Give beloved to  
my wife Anna, all bed and furniture. And to give and bequeath unto my beloved  
wife Anna, Best two shillings and one half more above two flag bottom chairs, one  
ash chair, two shillings and one half more above two flag bottom chairs, one  
chest, some curtain wove, one table, one chipp, and the remains of half dozen  
spoons, five knives and forks, my bed, my pot and tea kettle, one water-pail.  
The remains of my property, I leave to be divided equally  
between my son Caleb Best and my daughter Polly Best, after  
paying my just debts. I do hereby appoint my beloved wife Anna, Best to be  
my sole and lawful Executor, I do hereby acknowledge this to be my  
last will and Testament, and do make void and disannul all others  
whomsoever shall oppose it. As witness my seal.

The last will and Testament of William Hunning  
deceased. Exhibited and proved at Aug. term 1818 -

In the name of God, Amen. I William Hunning of Burke  
county in the state of North Carolina, being weak in body, but of sound  
disposing mind and memory, do make this my last will and Testament  
in the manner and form following. I give and recommend my soul  
to Almighty God who first gave it me, and as touching such worldly  
estate wherewithal he hath pleased god to bless me with in life, I give  
and devise and dispose of in the following manner and form. —

I give to my dear and loving wife, during her widowhood the use of  
all my cultivated lands, with the buildings thereon, her raising and keeping  
clear of expense my four youngest children until they come to lawful age.  
I give to my two sons Zechariah Hunning and Elijah Hunning  
all of that tract of land and plantation I bought of Thomas Summons buying  
on north river, to be divided equally between them, to them and their heirs forever.

Item. I give to my two daughters Peggy Hunning and Betsy Hunning, I mean  
my land and plantation on the west side of the main road commonly called the  
Olson plantation to be equally divided between them, my daughter Betsy I mean  
to have the north and Caleb's land, to them and their heirs forever. —

Item. I give to my daughter Sally Hunning the part of my plantation whereon I  
now live, that formerly belonged to James Walls agreeable to the lines that said  
Walls held it by, and I mean Thomas Whitehall's land, to her and her  
heirs forever. Item. I give to my daughter Abby Hunning that part of my land  
and plantation I bought of Stephen Taylor, agreeable to the lines that he held  
it by, as will appear by Deed from said Taylor containing about fifty seven  
acres more or less, to him and his heirs forever. —

Item. I give to my son William Hunning that part of my land and plantation  
which I bought of Thomas Gray and wife agreeable to the lines they held it by,  
as will appear by Deed from said Gray and wife, containing fifty seven acres  
more or less, to him and to his heirs forever. It is my will and desire that if  
either of my two sons Riddick Hunning or William Hunning should die  
before they have an heir lawfully begotten of his body, that his part of said land  
should go to the surviving one. It is further my will and desire that if  
either of my two daughters should die before they should have an heir lawfully  
begotten of her body, that her part of the land I now give and should go to  
the surviving one, I mean my two daughters Sally Hunning and Abby  
Hunning. Item. I end the use of all my perishable property, money and notes  
and accounts excepted to my wife during her widowhood, and if she should  
marry or dissent from this will, I give all the said perishable property to all  
my children and wife, to be equally divided to them and their heirs forever.  
Item. I give to my two sons Zechariah and Elijah Hunning one hundred and fifty  
dollars out of my notes to be equally divided between them, to them and their  
heirs forever. Item. I give to my wife my negro woman Cherry to her and  
her heirs forever. Item. I give to my two sons Riddick and William  
Hunning and my daughter Sally Hunning all the remainder of my property  
and estate of any kind whatsoever, which I have not already given away,  
after paying my just debts, to be equally divided between them, excepting his  
widowhood — he should be under the necessity to support his  
wife I now live in or build another small dwelling house not to exceed  
twenty feet in length, and sixteen feet in breadth with a shed, then and in  
that case she should have as much of the above estate or money as should  
repair or build the said house, the house of built shall be set on my daughter  
Sally Hunning's land. Lastly, I do hereby nominate, constitute and appoint my  
friend Thomas Sanderson, to be my whole sole Executor of this my last will  
and Testament, hereby revoking and disannulling all former will or wills  
herefore by me made, ratifying and confirming this and no other to be my  
last will and Testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand  
and affixed my seal this 10th day of January 1818. —
