Item. I give unto my wife Nancy Tatums, all the corn and pork in the house when I die, and likewise all the cows and wheat, that is growing on the land, at the time

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of my death, and all the goods that is on the land at the same time, and one
cow and furniture, and two pigs the first choice, and two bulls and two oxen, and
one table the first choice, and the best furniture and with the knives and
forks, to she and her heirs forever. Item. I bind unto my loving wife
Hinny Yatum one horse the first choice, and the riding chair and harness
and one cow and calf the first choice one feather bed and bedstead and furniture
the second choice, and two cows and lambs the first choice, and eight head

her heirs forever. Item. I give unto Hallowell Yatum my son, one half of the
marsh bought of James White senior, to him and his heirs forever. Item. I give
unto my son Anthony Yatum one cow and calf, and one and lamb, to him and his
heirs forever. Item. I give unto my son Hallowell Yatum one cow and calf and one
ox and lamb, to him and his heirs forever; and may it be known, I have given
them these things in addition to what I have formerly given them, that they may not
say I have cut them off with nothing. Item. I have all my property in doors and
out doors, that I have not all ready given away, to be sold, and out of the money the
property sells for, I give the sum of twenty dollars to William Yatum Tillet, to him
and his heirs and the remainder of the money arising from the sale, to be equally
divided between Anniis Brumsey and Elizabeth White, that is if there is any
remaining after my debts is paid. And now may it be known I leave my sole

thence across the said road by a water hole to a branch, thence down the center
of said branch to Williams Brabbel's line, thence along said Brabbel's line
southwardly to a white oak, thence down Gant's line to the first station, containing
fifty acres more or less, to she and her heirs forever. Item. I give unto my daughter
Polly Yatum three negroes by the name of Sue, Huber and Viola, and further

then after his death to be divided amongst his lawful heirs, to them and their heirs
forever. Item. I also bind unto my son Evan Solis one negro man by the name of James
during his natural life, and after his death I give said negro to his lawful heirs, then and
their heirs forever. Item. I give unto my son Evan Solis one feather bed and furniture
one chest to him and his heirs forever. Item. I give unto my daughter Sally White
three negroes, by the name of Charles, one by the name of Charly and Sally, and
feather bed and furniture, and one chest to she and her heirs forever —
Item. I give unto my daughter Sally White a sufficient quantity of my perishable property
at the death of my wife Elizabeth Solis to be sold for six months credit, to amount to one hundred
dollars, to she and her heirs forever. Item. All the remainder part of my property
that is not already given away, I give to my wife Elizabeth Solis, Evans Solis and Sally
White, to them and their heirs forever. Also leave Caleb Stridge, Master Painter and
Thomas White my whole and sole executors to this my last will and Testament. In witness
