In the name of God, Amen. I Charles Lindsey of Currituck
county and state of North Carolina, being weak and low in body, but of
perfect mind and memory, calling to mind the uncertainty of life &
the certainty of death, do make and publish this my last Will and
Testament in manner and form following: that is to say, first of all
I commend my soul into the hands of Almighty God, and my body
to the ground to be buried in a decent manner, at the discretion of
my executors, and as for what worldly goods it hath pleased God to bless
me with, I dispose of as follows, WITNESSE HERE. I leave unto my mother
Susanna Simpson, my land and house whereon she now lives,
during her natural life, and after her decease, I give and bequeath
unto my sister Dinah Lindsey, all my land and house that I
possess, to her and her heirs forever. I give unto my sister Dinah
Lindsey one cow called Mark and her yearling, one chest, to her and
her heirs. I leave I give and bequeath to my half brother James Simpson
one cow and calf called wit, one bull, and all the property which I
bought that night Alexander Simpson's, which was sold at vendue.
I give to the said James Simpson and his heirs forever. Then I give
and bequeath unto Daniel Simmons all the property that I hold
which I bought at his vendue, which was sold for to pay off his debts
and his heirs forever. I also give and bequeath to Daniel Simmons the
sum of twelve dollars out of the money that is due me at my death.
I leave I leave unto James Simpson one feather bed and furniture
during his life, and after his decease I give the same bed and furniture
to my sister Dinah Lindsey. I give to Alexander Simpson my
gun called a musket and one steel bag. After my just debts are
paid, I give to my mother the sum of thirty five dollars out of the
money that is due me at my death; and all the remainder of
my estate both personal and real, I give and bequeath to my sister
Dinah Lindsey and her heirs forever. Lastly I nominate, constitute
and appoint my friend Simcoe Sawyer my whole and sole
executor, to this my last will and Testament. In testimony
whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this fourth day
of November in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and

that I say, Padrick of the county of for said, in the name of the Lord, and in
these presents under the consideration of the shortness of time, to hear,
make my last will and testament. In the first place I give and bequeath
to my beloved son John McCoy, my best chest, I give and bequeath
to my beloved daughter Polly Snodgrass one linen wheel at my death, &
all my potter, and all my wearing apparel; and I give and bequeath
to my grand daughter Mary Gard and child, Grant for shillings,
current money of the state, and I give the orphan of Will Snow, by
name is William and Lydia Snow, and after paying all my just debts
and demands, I give and bequeath to my beloved grand son Daniel
Padrick all of the unimpaired part of my property, and I leave my
beloved son John McCoy, Mary and Polly, Executors. August the 10th
day 1812.

In the name of God Amen. I William Swiford being sick and low in health,
but of sound mind and memory, and considering it is appointed for all men
to die, do make and appoint this my last Will and Testament, and as touching
my worldly property it is my Will that all my just debts be paid first after my
decease by execution out of my estate. Secondly, I give to my son James Swiford
my plantation and swamp that I own in Tyne county, also one yoke of oxen
and one feather bed, to him and his heirs forever. Thirdly, I give to my son William
Swiford my plantation and land on the North Banks, that I bought Joseph
Hill's, also one yoke of oxen and one feather bed. Fourthly, I give to my son
Judson Swiford my plantation and land on the Middle Banks, that I bought
that I bought of Thomas Dist and one yoke of oxen, and one feather bed, and
I also give my negro fellow Jack to my two sons William and Judson Swiford.
Fifthly, I give to my daughter Mary Swiford one feather bed and furniture
and one linen wheel; and it is my Will that if either of my three youngest
children should die without heirs, that what I have given to that should
go to the other two. Sixthly, I give to my daughter Nancy Swiford, one
feather bed and furniture, and one linen wheel. Seventhly, I give to my grand
son Thomas Swiford one negro fellow named Solomon, and if he should die
under age, it is my Will, that my two daughters Clarice and Nancy should
have the said negro Solomon. Eighthly, I give eight and a half acres of land
that I bought of William Tomson, to William Cowell and his heirs forever.
Ninthly, I give to Polly Hurlbut one cow and calf. Tenthly, I give to my
beloved wife Hannah Swiford the use of all the remainder part of my estate
of every kind, during her life, and then to be divided equally amongst all my
children. I appoint my wife Hannah Swiford and child Peter executors to this
my last will and Testament. In witness whereof, I have hereunto set my
hand and seal this fourth day of June 1812.
