In the name of God, Amen. I Charles Lindsey of Lincolntown  
county and State of North Carolina, being weak and low in body, but of  
perfect mind and memory, casting to mind the uncertainty of life &  
the certainty of death, do make and publish this my last Will and  
Testament in manner and form following, that is to say; First of all  
I commend my soul into the hands of Almighty God, and my body  
to the ground to be buried in a decent manner, at the discretion of  
my executors, and as for what worldly goods it hath pleased God to bestow  
me with, I dispose of as follows. Item. I leave unto my mother  
Susanna Simpson, my land and house whereon she now liveth,  
during her natural life, and after her decease, I give and bequeath  
unto my sister Dinah Lindsey, all my land and houses that I  
possess, to her and her heirs forever. I give unto my sister Dinah  
Lindsey one cow called Hawk and her yearling, one chest, to her and  
her heirs. Item, I give and bequeath to my half brother George Simpson  
one cow and calf called Peet, one tub, and all the property which I  
brought that way Alexander Simpson, which was sold at Gardner.  
I give to the said George Simpson and his heirs forever. Item, I give  
and bequeath unto Daniel Simpson, all the property that I hold  
which I bought at Big Bend, which was sold for to pay off his debts  
and his heirs forever. I also give and bequeath to Daniel Simpson the  
sum of twelve dollars out of the money that is due me at my death  
Item I leave unto George Simpson one feather bed and furniture  
during his life, and after his decease, I give the same bed and furniture  
to my sister Dinah Lindsey. I give to Alexander Simpson my  
cow called a musket and one steel tray. After my just debts are  
paid, I give to my mother the sum of thirty five dollars out of the  
money that is due me at my death; and all the remainder of  
my estate both personal and real, I give and bequeath to my sister  
Dinah Lindsey and her heirs forever. Lastly, I nominate, constitute  
and appoint my friend Saman'r Sawyer my whole and sole  
executor, to this my last will and Testament. In testimony,  
whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this fourth day  
of November in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and

The State of North Carolina, Lincoln County, now all men by the presents  
that I Charles Lindsey of the county of Lincoln, in the name of the Lord, and in  
these presents under the consideration of the shortness of time, to hear  
make my last will and testament. In the first place I give and bequeath  
to my beloved son John, Mr. McCoy my best chest, I give and bequeath  
to my beloved daughter Polly Proctor our linens which at my death  
all my sister, and all my dearest apparel; and I give and bequeath  
to my beloved daughter Nancy Card and wife, Chest, two shillings  
copper money of the state, and I give the orphan of Will Snow, his  
name is William and Lydia Snow, and after paying all my just debts  
and demands, I give and bequeath to my beloved grand son David  
Lindsey all of the remainder part of my property, and I leave my  
beloved son John McCoy, his wife and Polly, Executor. August the 10th

First of all I leave unto my mother

In the name of God Amen. I William Gaillard being sick and low in health,  
but of sound mind and memory, and considering it is appointed for all men  
to die, to make and appoint this my last Will and Testament, and as touching  
my worldly property it is my Will that all my just debts be paid first after my  
decease by executor out of my estate. Secondly, I give to my son George Gaillard  
my plantation and slaves that I own in Lincoln county, also one yoke oxen  
and one feather bed, to him and his heirs forever. Thirdly, I give to my son Wallis  
Gaillard my plantation and land on the Neuse Banks, that I bought Joseph  
King, also one yoke of oxen and one feather bed. Fourthly, I give to my son  
Judson Gaillard my plantation and land on the Neuse Banks, that I bought  
that Slough of Thomas East and one yoke of oxen, and one feather bed, and  
I also give my negro fellow Jack to my two sons Wallis and Judson Gaillard.  
Fifthly, I give to my daughter Charlotte Gaillard one feather bed and furniture  
and one linen wheel; and it is my will that if either of my three youngest  
children should die without heir, that what I have given to that should  
go to the other two. Sixthly, I give to my daughter Nancy Gaillard one  
feather bed and furniture, and one linen wheel. Seventhly, I give to my grand  
son Thomas Gaillard one negro named Solomon, and if he should die  
under age, it is my will, that my two daughters, Charlotte and Nancy should  
have the said negro Solomon. Eighthly, I give eight and a half acres of land  
that I bought of William Johnson, to William Covell and his heirs forever,  
Ninthly, I give to Polly Harriet one cow and calf. Tenthly, I give to my  
beloved wife Hannah Gaillard the use of all the remainder part of my estate  
of every kind, during her life, and then to be divided equally amongst all my  
children. I appoint my wife Hannah Gaillard and Billy Toliver executors to this  
my last will and Testament. It witness whereof, I have hereunto set my  
hand and seal this fourth day of June 1812.
