- In the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and sixty nine, he having been born February in year long established duly proved and the said Testimony executed by a Notary qualified in the form of law the said Wills were ordered to be registered according to law. Will & Testament of William Williams before followeth. In Hoc Verba.

North Carolina Currituck County. In the Name of God Amen. William's wife and I myself and Province being very sick unto perfect memory thank be to God for it knowing she hence appointed for all men to die. In the first place I recommend myself to Almighty God that rule us and me and Body to be buried at the the Burialion of my forefathers: and this I wish to do to be my last will and Testament, and next I beseech and desire of in the following manner to leave my Land between my two Sons Thomas and James, Thomas to have the Slaves & a Branch and James to have the other. And only my wife to have her fee. And whatsoever in the rest of my Estate to myself and not to be interdicted. It is my Desire that my Son James upon his marriage that his Children is between my Sons. In my Daughter Anna's Payment upbramend Davis and any loving wife who shall execute to which I have hasted. And my last and true Seal this 29 Day of October 1768.

Testament of James Parker follows. In Hoc Verba.

Sixty and one year in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and sixty nine. He having been born in the month of February in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and sixty nine. I do make and declare this to be my last will & Testament in the presence of a Notary Public and memory. I declare to be to God above same to make this my last will & Testament in the presence of a Notary Public and memory. First I beseech my Soul to Almighty God that gave it me knowing that I may have no dependence on this world continuing hereon knowing bid my Beloved Redeemer ever to well to make my confession for us and as to myself to be buried and obserue the manner of the Burialion of my Deceased as before mentioned. My will is that all my Debts be paid. Item I give to my Dearest living wife a two pound fifteen shillings of Sterling money. Item I give to my Son Nathaniel Parker one hundred Dollars in silver and two more Dollars. Item I give to my Son James Parker one black & white Cow with a large head & horns increase; and two ewes & lambs. Item I give to my Daughter Rachael Dugan, no young man to my Daughter Rachael one red Cow named Lucy with her increase. Item I give to my Daughter Nancy Parker one white Horse named Fanny. Item I give to my Daughter Lydia Abbott one Shilling Sterling money. Item I give to my Son Thomas Parker a half Hhds to my three Sons Nathaniel, James & Thomas Parker. Item I give to my Son Anna Parker a one fourth Part of all my Chattels was made & left them underfied to Nathaniel, James, and Thomas Parker. Also my Beloved Son. Item I give to my Son Thomas Parker my self and lying & lying in Currituck to him to take care of his Body lawfully be gotten. Item I give to my Son Thomas Parker all the remainder of my Estate I will not loose. And third that I have not already given away in the other Wills, exceeding four Hhds. I do appoint Nathaniel Parker and Thomas Parker to be my executors to this my last will & Testament and orderly managing all other. And seal his
