having been shown & thereunto given Oath & exhibited, duly proved, and the respective Executors
being qualified in due form of Law the said wills were ordered to be registered, according to
the Statute in that behalf made.

In the County of Currituck North Carolina. In the Name of God Amen. I William Williams of the said County and
Province being very sick & in perfect Memory, Thanks be to God for it knowing that I am
approaching for all men to die. In the first Place I recommend my Soul to Almighty God that will
will me and Body to be buried at the the Buriall place of my Ancestors; and that I recommend to be
in my last will and Testament, and now I bequeath and Dispose of in the following manner
I leave my Land between my two Sons Thomas and James; Thomas to have the Share to
Branch and James to have the Share but only my life to have her for Maintenance, and all
the rest of my Estate to my wife and not to be interupted. It is my Desire that of my Negro
I bequeath to my Daughter Anne; I bequeath
I bequeath to my Daughter Anne and my loving wife, whole Estate Executors, to which I have bequeath

February. In the Name of God Amen I James Parker of the County of Currituck being very sick & weak
of Body this of a perfect mind & memory thanks be to God for it I make this my last will & Testament, in the
first Place I recommend my Soul to Almighty God that will me and Body to be buried at the the Buriall place of my Ancestors; and that I recommend to be
in my last will and Testament, and now I bequeath and Dispose of in the following manner
I leave my Land between my two Sons Thomas and James; Thomas to have the Share to
Branch and James to have the Share but only my life to have her for Maintenance, and all
the rest of my Estate to my wife and not to be interupted. It is my Desire that of my Negro
I bequeath to my Daughter Anne; I bequeath
