movables. Be sold to pay all my lawful debts. Secondly I give
and bequeath unto my well beloved wife Luke Duncan all
my movable property with all my stock, cattle, horses, hogs and
sheep with all household goods and working tools. Requiring
that she be peaceable proud of my plantation during her
natural life and then all my lands and and plantation
be sold and the moneys divided between my brothers to wit
William Duncan, Edmund Duncan, and Joz^{ph} Duncan like-
wise I appoint William Duncan and Joz^{ph} Duncan to
be my Executors this fifteenth day of October 1793. Jos^{ph}
Sara^{Ann} Roach Charlotte^{Ann} Roach.
