Sixthly - I give and bequeath unto my niece Sivia Hooks, Daughter of David Hooks one Negro Woman called Rachel, and her child Ann, and all her Increase, one wash stand, and one Feather Bed and furniture. Seventhly, I give and bequeath unto my nephew James Dumm, his Slave and assigns for ever. The Remainder of the Land that I purchased from my Brother William Dumm (say about four hundred and fifteen acres, the other part of Said Land, I have deeded to him heretofore) all of which Tract of Land, was formerly owned by James Clark, Also my Negro man Cam (now in his possession). Also my Negro Woman Hannah, and her Six Children: Silvia, Alexander, Washington, Lilly, Esther, Mary, and their Increase. Eighthly - I give and bequeath unto my Brother Robert Dumm, my Gold Watch. Ninthly - I give and bequeath unto my Brother William Dumm, all my Estate, both Real and personal of every Description (not already divided), including Lands, Negroes, Stock, furniture, and Goods and every part and parcel of property which may Remain, (after giving the Legacies heretofore made and devised. Tenthly It is my wish and request that my Brother William Dumm (shall pay out of his own funds, all the debts that I may have. Lastly, I nominate and appoint my Brother William Dumm, and my Nephew James Dumm Executor, to this my last Will and Testament. R. working all other Will or Wills, heretofore made by me, signed sealed and acknowledged, in presence of, Jas. H. Hicks, Wm B. Barden. This twenty Eighth day of January (28th) 1829. Item I give and bequeath to my daughter Nancy Abner one Bed and furniture and one cow and calf which she hath already Received. Item I give and bequeath to my son Abner Ellison one horse and furniture which he hath already Received and my will is that my Executors do cause to be made to Brian W. Hatfield a good and lawful Right to all the

land my bond calls for, and lastly I do hereby make & appoint my wife Ann Ellison and my son in law Matthew Ward full and sole Executor of this my last will and Testament and declaring this to be my last will and Testament in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand. Duplin County } I James Evans of the State and County aforesaid - being weak and in a low state of health but of sound mind and memory and calling to mind the Mortality of my body - and that it ordains of God once for man to die. Have ordained this my last will and Testament in manner and form as followeth. 1st I recommend my soul to God who gave it - and my body to be buried in a decent and Christian like manner by my Executor who I shall hereafter nominate and appoint. 2^d It is my will that all my just debts be first paid out of my movable Estate. - 3^d I give to my well beloved wife Elizabeth during her natural life, my House and all that part of my Plantation from the second bottom above my Orchard - down the swamp to Mr. Mapells line - Beginning at a gum a corner of a four hundred acre survey being his own and James Mapells corner that stands partly west of the Plantation thence a corner to strike the head of the second bottom (aforesaid) in the field and from thence to a pine in the head of a small branch West of Fanny Gallisons House - it being her corner and Evans corner - thence the various courses of Fanny Gallisons

line George Rowen line & Thomas Garrisons line to Mapells line - Thence Mapells line to his corner formerly Mellersons Map and said Evans corner thence to the beginning the gum all which land I give to my said wife during her natural life time - And as she should again marry after my decease - Thence in that case it is my will that the lower half of said land & plantation be laid off to my son James Evans - and it is my will and desire that, that after the decease of my said wife - Elizabeth - that the whole described land aforesaid devolve to my said son James Evans as his full share of all my Lands more or less. 4th I give and bequeath to my son William Benton Evans all that part of my land lying South of my Plantation - and joining to the above described Lands - Beginning at Wags and his own corner at a spruce pine in the head of a small branch called Tarikhin branch - thence a long way line to Lewis Hodgman's line and John Dickson line to a white Oak - thence a straight line to Mapells thence the N^o Cartway branch near Cross ford - thence Mapells line to Willms old corner - thence a straight line to Wags corner - thence beginning all which land I give and bequeath to my said son William Benton Evans as his full share of all my Lands more or less. 5th I give and bequeath to my son David Evans all that part of my land and part of my Plantation lying above and joining the other two described tracts or parcels of land. Beginning at the gum aforesaid Mapells & Evans corner running thence to the head of the second bottom above the orchard in the field. thence to the head of the small branch near Fannys field a pine Fannys & Evans corner - thence I^d Evans line to Mr. Mapells and along Mapells line to said Evans own line to a gum - thence beginning all which land I give and bequeath to my said son David Evans his full share of all my lands more or less. 6th I give to my well beloved son Benjamin Evans Ten Shillings to be paid out of my Estate by my Executor. 7th I give to my well beloved daughter Rebekah Evans Ten Shillings to be paid out of my estate by my Executor. 8th I give to my well beloved daughter Margaret Mapell Ten Shillings to be paid by my Executor. 9th I give to my well
