

do make and ordain this to be my last will and testament in the manner and form as follows - First I recommend my soul to God that give it me and that my body have decent burial at the discretion of my executors hereafter mentioned - Secondly I will that so much of my property that can be best spared from the use of my family, be used to pay my debts and the remain part of property of every nature and known whatsoever to receive in the possession of my beloved wife Hannah Webb the use of her support with her children during her natural life or widowhood with the crop now planted on the plantation and in case of her marriage or there should appear to be willful waste of the property then and in such case the executors herein mentioned may have equal division of the property between my beloved wife Hannah Webb and his two children Sally Webb and John W. Webb, and in order to put the within will into execution I appoint my friend John Gribble Executor to this my last will and testament, as witness my hand and seal at Duplin this second day of May in the year of our Lord anno 1816

J. Abelson Weston being weak and low in spirit tho in proper sense at present, do make this my last will and testament. Item. I do give and bequeath unto my Nephew Ruben Weston, son of Ruben Weston, my plantation with two hundred and fifty acres of land thereto belonging to receive at the age of twenty-one years. Item. I do leave John Johnson to have the plantation till the heirs of the boy, coming of age to have it two years rent free and to clear two acre of land for every year he lives on it afterwards and paying the rest free, failing the time he uses on it. Item I do give unto John Johnson all the corn there is on the Plantation

tation now, and two hundred weight of pork two hens and pigs and a work beast to use next summer &c. Item do give to my nephew Ruben Weston daughter of Ruben Weston one feather bed and furniture &c. I do give unto my brother Ruben Weston all my horses and dogs and bridle and saddle and two beds &c Except ~~one~~ <sup>myself</sup> I give unto my nephew Lawrence Weston daughter of Ruben Weston & Item. I give all my property unto my nephew Nathaniel Weston daughter of Ruben Weston &c Signed sealed and delivered in the presence of us John Sullivan & Benjamin Snipes Delilah <sup>his</sup> P. Outlaw — Abelown <sup>his</sup> Weston <sup>real</sup>

The 22<sup>d</sup> day of January in the year of our Lord 1798  
I John Wright of Duplin County in the State of North Carolina being aged and infirm and in a low state of bodily health, but of a perfect sound mind and memory thanks be to God for the same and calling to mind the mortality of my body and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die, do make and ordain this my last will and testament in manner and form following, that is to say. I recommend my soul to God who gave it and my body to the earth to be decently buried at the discretion of my executors my worldly estate to disposed of in the manner following —

In premises to my beloved wife Rebekah Wright I leave the whole plantation wherein I now live (including all my lands from the Oak near the plum tree upon the hill by the swamp running a direct course from thence up by son David Wright where the old fence formerly in the my sons Thomas Wright lived during his natural life which land I do now possess and how not heretofore disposed of with all the improvements and appurtenances thereto, due unto me any rice belonging and my half of the still and all my negroes except such as are herein given and otherwise bequeathed, with all my stock of every kind whatever exceeding all my horses cattle Hogs and sheep to her during her own life. Item I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Rebekah all my house hold and kitchen furniture of every kind whatsoever whatsoever of as she may think proper, among which shall also be disposed of as she pleases, which she is to enjoy without interruption — Item to my son Thomas Wright I give and bequeath after the decease of his said mother Rebekah that part of my land wherein I now live the west side of the avenue, the line to begin at the corner of the trees where the old still formerly stood, and to run thence with the avenue including, my
