The following Negroes to Mr. Teachey, Matt, Nancy and Peter to be Equally divided between them during the time to come and thine his forever.

Ninety I will that my Sister Barbara Teachey after her death shall have £100 of money at my decease

Twenty I will that Daniel Teachey son of John Teachey have one hundred dollars cash.

Eleven I will that if any money be left on hand at my death mentioned will be the property of James Teachey and his Mother Margaret Teachey with what Testimonials and for that may be on hand with all Notes and acc'ts due may be on hand shall be paid to poor people as Congress pay without family of him I shall wish to have them Exonerated

Twelve I leave to John Teachey my Cow & foal Teachey first Shillings Starting and also two shillings Bony Bony have £100 sent to her and his.

Thirteen I constitute and appoint my nephews James Teachey and David Teachey Executors to this my last will in writing whereof I have set my hand and seal at Sycamore this 8<sup>th</sup> day of February in the year of our Lord one thousand Eight Hundred and Six, 1826.

Memory thank her for her service and calling to mind that she  
allotted for all men equal to die I strengthen man and ordain  
this my last Will and Testament.

And first of all I recommend my soul to god who gave it and my  
body to be buried in the dust in a Christian like manner at  
the discretion of my friends and Executors hereof to be  
mentioned or named here as touching what worldly

property it hath pleased God to bless me with in this world  
I leave it in manner and sum as follows that is to say, £100  
and first of all I leave Mrs. Garrison and accounts to my  
debtors to my wife beloved wife Elizabeth Tally

I give and bequeath my Negro woman Eliza named Jane  
Almy her Natural wife or widow husband and afterwards belonging  
to my daughter Mary Tally to her and her heirs forever.  
Also my house and plantation. I leave to my Beloved  
Wife Elizabeth Tally and as much of the furniture of each  
as shall be sufficient for her use & her two year old  
Horse two Sows and pigs all the Cows and Calves that  
are called her own one Heater bed and Furniture one  
Horse and Chair and Harness her English and the one kept  
of it at her Death if not Concordant to her own disposure  
Except the house and plantation & all the other hoof  
to be Equally divided Between Margaret Story Colver  
and David Tally and to my daughter Jane Johnson  
I leave five Shillings due to my son Hugh Tally & leave five  
Shillings due to my Son John Tally & leave five  
Shillings due to my Daughter Elizabeth Coston & leave  
five Shillings and the remainder of my property now  
William or Necessity needed to be sold at a six months credit  
and the Money to be equally divided among the  
first named children (viz) Margaret Mary Colver  
and David Tally and last of all I constitute  
and appoint my two Friends John Gilson and  
Thos Garrison my whole sole Executors to this  
my last will and Testament dismally all others

Wills & Testaments by me made do witness where  
I hereunto set my hand and seal this 9<sup>th</sup> day of  
June A.D. the Year of our Lord One Thousand Eight Hundred and  
Fiftieth — 1815.

I John Worsley of the County of Duplin & State of North Carolina  
laid in Body but of perfect mind and memory and ready money  
thanks Be to God for it, and calling to mind that it is expedient  
for all men once to die do make and ordain this my last Will  
and Testament first of all I recommend my Soul into the hands  
of God that you it, and my Body to be buried in a Christian like  
Manner & the service of my Ecclesiastical Church & shall henceforth  
appoint.

I leave to my well Beloved Wife Elizabeth Worsley during her life  
time or widow hood one negro man named Jim and his wife  
& Calvers one Cow and a pony to be furnished and at her death  
to give paid in Gold, one Rose Mary Diddle & Bridle or  
Money to be given to my daughter Charlotte Worsley to her and  
her heirs forever

Item I give and bequeath unto my daughter Charlotte Worsley  
Hir Negro Slave Name Sam & Garrison, Jr and former Dark.  
Decent bed & furniture in Money to her and her heirs forever  
to be paid in Gold & one Day moon with two white feet.

Item I give and bequeath unto my Grand Son William Worsley  
all the Lands that I possess on the North Side of Cauley Swamp  
in Duplin County and Fifteen Cows and Calves and one  
Hundred Silver Dollars to him and his heirs forever  
and one Negro Slave named Toney.

Item I give and bequeath unto my Grand Son Peter Worsley all  
the Lands and possessions that I possess on the South Side  
of Cauley Swamp. Whereas I now know and am hundred  
Silver Dollars and one Negro man named Friday one Red and  
furniture and fifteen Cows & Calves to him and his heirs forever.  
I give and bequeath unto my daughter Sarah Wilkinson  
Hir furniture in Money to her & her heirs

I give and bequeath unto my daughter Mary Cherry. Fair furniture  
in Money to her & her heirs  
and the remainder part of my Estate to be sold and the  
Money to be equally divided amongst my three Daughters  
Sarah Wilkinson, Mary Cherry and Charlotte Worsley  
Likewise I leave my Sons law Robert Cherry Lawyer  
Executor to this my last Will and Testament in Writing
