I David Wright of the County of Duplin and State of North
Carolina being of advanced age & in low State of body
Heath but of sound mind disposing mind & memory therefore
be to God for the same & Calling to mind that it is appointed
once for all men to die I have thought it best to dispose of
my worldly estate among my heirs by making this my
Will and bequeathing all after former Wills by me made
do make this my last Will and Testament in this manner and
form following.

And first bequeathed my Soul to God who gave it and my
body to the dear Father Whence it came to be decently entombed
at the discretion of my Executors herein after named and
secondly that all my just debts shall be paid by my said
Executors, and thirdly in order to more enable my wife
the better to raise my small children and educate them without
her being obliged to charge them board and cloathing, I bequeath
her without - my two old negroes Tim & Maes as long
as she and the Executors think they will be of service to her
and then be at the expense of the Estate. I then bequeath her during
her Natural life the lands I now live on & Capstone land
I bought of Brother Thos Wright and that until my
son David Wright becomes of lawful age on Condition

that she Consents to have & rented out in such manner as the Executors
may think best I also bequeath her the following named Negroes viz.
Brother Easton Milly, Tim and Stock and Henry which she has
liberty to keep as long as she (or any part of them) out also my
Kitchen & Kitchen furniture all such as she cannot well
do without so as to enable her to give a bed furniture to each
child when they marry or become of lawful age. I give her
to dispose of as she pleases. my new gill house and my old horse
called Morn and her driver of two of the Mules It is my will that
a part of the crop stack & provisions as well as sufficient for
her and family to be left unble until a new crop coming in
then I give to my son Thos. H. Wright the Negroes & Morn which
he has already received by deed of gift also the furniture given
by me to him in addition to this I give him my negro boy James
to him & his heirs forever I then I give to my son John Wright
the money he has already received & him in addition to this
the Negroes he has already received. I also give him at my death
my Negro boy Button and one hundred dollars for his attire
on my while on my sick bed.

I then I give to my Daughter Mary C. Beuch wife of Lewis B. Beuch
the Negroes Morn and furniture she has already received & to
my Grandson Williams Beuch her son. I give & bequeath
my Negro boy named to him and his heirs forever.

I then I give to my daughter Rebecca E. Hooks wife of Thos. Hooks
the Negroes she has in possession by deed of gift and the furniture
she has received and seventy dollars to buy a house if she
thinks proper to put it to that use to other and her heirs forever.

I then I give to my daughter Mary E. Wright my negro girls
Nannah and Dolly and one hundred dollars to buy her a horse
also one bed bedstead & furniture to her and her heirs forever.

I then I give to my son David Wright my lands that I bought of my
Brother Thos. Wright the landers of which may be obtained by
referring to the deed also my young black Morn also one
bed and furniture & bedstead to him and his heirs forever.

I then I give to my son Isaac Wright all the balance of my land
at the death of his mother also one bed bedstead & furniture
and one hundred dollars to receive when he marries or
becomes of age to him and his heirs forever
