 In the name of God Amen. I Archibell Bell of the county
 of Duplin State of North Carolina County seat and week of body
 but of sound and perfect memory Thanks be to God for the same
 and calling to mind the mortality of my body and knowing it
 is appointed for all men once to die to make constitutions and
 and appoint this my last will and testament manner &
 form following. That is to say first of all I give and recommend
 my soul into the hands of Almighty God that gave it &
 my body to be decently buried at the discretion of my executors
 nothing doubting but at the day of judgement I shall receive
 the same again by the mighty power of God. And calling to mind
 the worldly estate wherewithal it has pleased Almighty God
 to bless me and bestow upon me in this life do bequeath the
 same in the following manner - Item I leave to my dearly
 beloved wife Mary Bell all my whole Estate during her

natural life or widowhood and then to be divided as follows
 Item. I give to my son George Bell five Shillings.
 Item I give unto my son Oscar Bell five Shillings
 Item I give unto my son Benjamin Bell ten Shillings
 Item I give unto my daughter Neomy Jernigan my negro
 weded name Rose together with two cows and calves. I give to
 my daughter Bond Clark my negro fellow Darley and two
 cows and calves. I give unto my daughter Sarah Frazer two
 cows and calves. Item I give unto my daughter Mary Bell my
 negro boy named Delph with half my cattle that is on the
 plantation when I now live after taking out six cows and calves
 which I give equally unto Sarah Frazer Neomy Jernigan and
 Nancy Nobles. I also give unto my daughter Mary two feather beds
 and furniture and one half my pinto with one bay mare and I like-
 wise give unto Neomy Jernigan four cows and lands. Item I give
 unto my son Joseph Bell fourteen acres of land. Land in-
 cluding the plantation wherein I now live also one negro
 boy name Andrew with part of my cattle and stock on the plan-
 tation wherein I now live also one whole stock of cattle on So
 river in possession of Anna May Morris with all my plan-
 tation tools together with my still hand mill grain stone and
 all other utensils belonging to the said plantation also one bay horse +
 one bay mare and a pair of oxen to tend the plantation with
 it is my desire that my son Joseph sell the gray mare and
 gray horse for money for the use of the plantation only to buy
 daughter Neomy as much calico as will make her a gown
 the gray mare colt I likewise give unto Joseph also two rifle
 guns and one shot gun likewise all my stock of hogs. It is also
 my will and desire that if my son Joseph Bell should die with-
 out an heir the land I give him should be divided between Jane
 Jernigan's children and George Clark. that is to say Jernigan
 children to have all the land on the So side of Beaufort
 and George Clark children to have that on the north side of
 Beaufort river. Lastly I nominate commissioners and
 appoint my beloved wife Mary Bell and my
 son Joseph Bell full and sole Executrix
 of this my last will and testament being now
 and amending and making void all former

wills and testaments whates ever I return whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal. This the twenty third day of September one thousand seven hundred and seventy nine - Signed sealed published and declared by the said Archibell Bell as his last will and testament in presence of us George Smith

I leave to my oldest son at y^t day of my wife's marriage or y^t day of her death and if rest of my lands i leave to be sold and divided equally amongst them John Brock and Daniel Joanes Esq.
