 The place I now live I give and bequeath to my dear son Thomas  
 Benjamin & Hugh with my beloved wife having her churh of the same  
 place her life time. And further I give and bequeath unto my two  
 Sons George & Ann one hundred and fifty acres of land on the  
 east side of North east river and further I give and bequeath to my son  
 James one hundred acres of land on the ~~North east river~~<sup>North</sup> side of  
 Island Creek and all my goods & chattels to kept together until some of my  
 children shall part off from the rest and which ever shall first leave the  
 family is to receive one tenth part of my all my penchale property and I  
 live my son Thomas ~~be~~ Commiss and Timothy Teasley to be my  
 Exes. Test Andrew Shally & John Shally - Thomas Commiss

 Archibald Clark in Duplin County the Province of North Carolina  
 being very sick and weak of body but of perfect mind and memory thanks  
 be given to God for the same and calling to mind the mortaliy of  
 my body and knowing it is appointed for all men once to die do make  
 and ordain this my last will and testamant. That is to say first of  
 all I give and recommend my soul unto the hands of Almighty God  
 that gave it and for my body I recommend to the earth to be de-  
 cently and a christian like manner to be buried at the discretion of  
 my Executors. nothing doubting but at the general resurrection I

shall receive the same again by the mighty power of God, and as touching  
 worldly estate as it hath pleased God to bless me with in this life. I give and  
 dispose of in the manner following First my will and desire is that the land  
 and plantation wherein I now live be sold by Exes and that the money arising  
 from such sale be applied to the payment of my just debts also all the rest of  
 my estate of what kind foun. I likewise desire may be sold by my  
 Exes such things as is hereafter this is despatched. Secondly. I give  
 and bequeath to my beloved wife Alice my black horse and our  
 feather bed and furniture and one spinning wheel, and my will  
 and desire is that whatever of my of my estate shall be left after  
 all my just debts paid be equally divided between my wife and  
 all my brothers and Sisters. And I do hereby constitute and  
 appoint my brother John Clark my whole & sole Ex of this

John Cook hereby revoking all others. First I give my body to the dust  
 from whence it came to be buried in a decent and christian  
 like manner at the discretion of my Exes hereafter to be mentioned  
 and my soul to God that gave it it not doubting but I shall  
 be raged up at the day of the resurrection and be led into  
 glory through the merits of Jesus Christ my redeemer in whom  
 I trust. First I give the plantation & land on which I now
