witnesses thereto and at the same time Mary Busley one of the
Executors named in the said will qualified as Executor
agreeable to Law First James Pearce Clerk. In the name of
God amen I Austin Busley of the State of North Carolina
and County of Duplin being in perfect mind and memory
thanks be to God.) do this the 30th day of September viz
the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty
two make and ordain this my last will and testament, in
mannor and form as follows that is to say. First I recommend

my soul to God and my body to the earth to be
buried in a christian like manner at the discretion of my
Executors and to bestow my worldly estate. I dispose of
that in manner following to wit. First I give and bequeath
to my wife Mary Busley during her natural life that part
of land beginning on the east side of alligator pond on
the line which I the testator bought from Jacob Mathis to run
thence a straight line to the old field pond thence a straight line
to the run of Mullens creek ten poles below my mill. thence
down the run of Mullens creek to the lower line of my land.
Thence the various courses of my land to a lightwood. thence
on the south side of the red cat pond thence as that line to the beginning
and after her decease to my son Austin Busley also one bed and fur-
niture four cows and calves the gray horse and riding chair one
negro boy Jim^d during her life one negro boy name Willis to be used for
the term of ten years - 2d I give to son Bass Busley that part of
my land bounded as follows Beginning at a light wood on the west
side of alligator pond and running thence as the line laid off-

to my wife to the run of Millers Creek thence a line due north to the north line of a survey of two hundred acres thence as a line of that two hundred acre survey to the eastern boundary of my land thence crossing the mill pond & thence it comes to the line of a survey of one hundred acres thence as that line to the line that divides between my land and Henry Porters thence as that line to a corner tree to the south side of a regular pond thence to the beginning. 3rd I give to my son Austin Bueley all the rest of my land lying on the north side of Millers Creek, also a survey of fifty acres which I bought from Denis Cannon, adjoining the lands of Peter Carttore. 4th I give to my daughter Ally Lavin one hundred acres of land lying on the head of Clear run which she now has in possession, and I leave all that part of land which I bought of James Kenan heirs to be sold on a credit of twelve months and the monies thence arising to be divided as follows to my son John Bueley the sum of ten dollars, and to my son Samuel Bueley the sum of ten dollars. To my son Henry Bueley the sum of ten dollars. And to my son Myron Bueley the sum of ten dollars. 5th I give to daughter Elizabeth Bueley one negro girl name Hannah at the time of her marriage. 6th I give to my daughter Nancy Bueley one negro girl name Dinah at the time of her marriage. I give to my daughter Mary Bueley one negro boy name Ernie at the time of her marriage. 7th I give to my daughter Sarah Gore one negro fellow name Sanks to be delivered to her at the expiration of ten years from my decease. 8th Edwenna Bueley one negro woman name Mary, at the time of her marriage. I also give eighty acres of land lying on my branch whereon Eda Carroll now lives to be sold on a credit of twelve months and the monies thence arising to be disposed of at the direction of my Executors for the support of my children. I naming to the sd Eda Carroll her life time in the above named eighty acres of land if she pleases to live on it, and all the rest of my worldly estate to be sold at the discretion of my executors, and the monies after paying all my just debts to be disposed of by my executors to the use of my children I naming such of my plantation tools as my executors may judge necessary to the use of my family. I also make an appropriation of so much money out of the money arising from the sale of my estate as shall be sufficient to repair my mill in such a manner as may be judged necessary. And I do also make and obtain my good friends Gibson Sloan and Lewis Carttore together

with my wife Mary Beesley Executors of this my last will and
 Testament in witness whereof I have here unto set my hand and
 seal the day above written. Signed sealed and published by the

 penurable part of my estate - Thirdly I give and bequeath to Catharine
 Dickson Daughter of Robert Dickson dead, my negro woman Lino^t &
 her youngest child to her & her heirs for ever. Fourthly I give & bequeath
 to my brother Redar Bryan two youngest children, to my sister Charlotte
 Whitfield two youngest children and to my sister Catherine
 Buntiss two youngest children the whole of the remaining part
 of my estate not here to fore willed, to be equally divided be-
 tween them, to them and their heirs forever. Lastly I nominate
 constitute and appoint my beloved brother Redar Bryan and
 Lewis Whitfield Executors to this my last will and testament.
 hereby revoking all other wills by me made here to fore In witness
 thereof I have here unto set my hand and seal at Duplin
 this twenty third day of Janry One thousand seven hundred & ninety three
