 I Catharine Best of County of Duplin & State of North Carolina being
 weak in body but of sound mind do make and publish this my last will
 and testament in manner and form following. 1st I give to my daughters
 Mary and Elizabeth Best the slaves or interest I have in my negro
 woman slave Bessie and her two children Jacob & Travis to them &
 their heirs forever. Likewise all my cattle and hogs horses & kitchen
 furniture plantation tools &c to be equally divided between them at
 my death except so much of the above named property as will be necessary brought
 out. 2nd I give to my niece Catherine Frederick one three year old heifer.
 3rd I give to my grand son John Williams Best the sum of ten
 dollars to be raised out of my stock or furniture. 4th I do hereby
 constitute and appoint Andrew Mc Intire Exr of this my last
 will & testament. In witness whereof I have set my hand and seal
 this 9th May 1813. Signed Sealed & published in the presence

 thinks be given to God. Therefor calling unto mind the mortality of my
 body and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die. do
 make and obtain this my last will and testament that is to
 say principally and first of all I give & recommend my soul to God
 who gave it & for my body I recommend to the earth to be buried
 in a Christian like and decent manner at the discretion of my
 Exr nothing doubting but at the general resurrection I shall receive
 the same by the mighty power of God and notwithstanding such worldly
 estate wherewithal it has pleased God to bless me with in this
