I then I give and bequeath to my beloved wife my negro woman named Fannie & all the stock that belongs to the plantation and Jimmy Negro fellow upon the plantation for the maintenance of the children upon the plantation. I then I give and bequeath all the rest of my Estate to be Equally divided amongst my nine Children Joseph Scott Jonathan Scott. Nimrod James Chestnut Joshua Roder Abigail and Mary Scott and Peggy. I also constitute and appoint Jonathan Carr and my son Jonathan Scott my sole and sole Executors of this my Last will and Testament whereunto I have set my hand and fixed my seal this 26th day of December one thousand seven hundred and seventy. Being very sick and so weak in body but of perfect mind and memory thanks be given unto God of our calling unto mind Morlaty of my body and knowing that it is appointed for all men and to dye do move and ordain this my last Will and Testament that is to say for ever expelly and first of all I give and bequeath my Soul unto the hands of God that give it me and for my body I bequeath it to the earth to be buried in a Christian like decent manner at the discretion of my Executors Nothing doubting but at the general Resurrection I shall receive the same by the mighty power of God and as touching worldly Estate Wherewith I pleased God to bless me in this life I give devise and dispose of of the same in the following manner and form Impromised it is my will and I do order that in the first place all my debts just and General Charges be paid and satisfied I then I give and bequeath unto Margaret my dearly beloved wife all my goods and Chattels lands houses and Improvements Horses on Cart Hags and Sheep and Negroes and she is to enjoy the benefits of all these things I Love named Susan and Virtue during her life or widowhood I then I give to my older Son John Sloan one shilling I then I give my Son David Sloan M^r Mansfield and all that belongs to it one shilling I then I give one feather bed and furniture and one two years horse and one Negro boy all things I then I give to my Son Edson Sloan the plantation where I live now and one feather bed and furniture and one Negro boy to me and one year old Colt I then I give to my daughter Margaret Sloan one feather bed and furniture and one Negro boy boy born I then I give to my daughter Susanna Sloan one feather bed and furniture and Negro boy Frank

Item I give my daughter Polly Brock one Negro man
Ruck Each one of these Negroes to them an equal part
of what is left after her death

ordain this my last will and Testament. I name and
give following Principally and first of all I bequeath
the land and my body to the
said County to be buried at the discretion of my Executors
Nothing doubting but at the General Resurrection
I shall Recurr the same again by the almighty Power
of God. And as Touching my worldly Estate that God
has Blessed me withal in this life I do give

and dispose of in manner and form following. I promise
first I will that all my just debts and funeral Charges be paid
and discharged. Item I do give to my well Beloved Wife Mildred
Sloan all my whole Estate during her life or widowhood and
after her Death or Marriage to be sold and one third of the
Money I bequeath to her, of all Except my lands and that I will
to be sold and all the Money to be Equally divided amongst my
Children and the Children's part to be let out or Interest
till they are of age to receive it.

Item I do appoint my well Beloved Wife Mildred Sloan and my
brother John Charles Sloan Executors to this my last will
and Testament, and I do hereby empower my above said
Executors to make sale of my part or parts of the estate on
any time when they shall think proper and I do Revoc-
ably and make vain all other and former Will or Wills
heretofore by me made allowing and acknowledging this and no
other be my last will and Testament in witness whereof I
have hereunto set my hand and fixed my Seal this 23rd day of
November in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred
and sixty seven
