

this my last will and testament - First of all I recommend my soul unto the hands of almighty God that at first gave it & my body I recommend to the earth to be buried in a decent Christian burial at the discretion of my Exes not doubting but at the general resurrection I shall receive it again by the mighty power of God and as touching some small estate as it hath pleased God to bless me with I give and bequeath them in the following manner and form this to say I give and bequeath to my son William Bland Three hundred acres of land lying in Virginia on the head of Powell Branch also a some mares and colts - &c - I give and bequeath to my grand son James Bland the son of William Bland & Rachel his wife two cows and one calf & 3 yearlings also two feather beds & furniture to him also twenty pounds of proclamation money also I give him my riding horse & saddle & bridle - (I true) I give and bequeath to my son Thomas Bland five shillings (Item) I give and bequeath to my son Charles Bland 5 Shillings Item I give and bequeath to my daughter Mary Parker one side saddle & my dogs Item I give and bequeath to my son James Bland all the goods of mine that he has in hand or in his possession. Item I give and bequeath to my son John Bland 5 Shillings Item I give and bequeath to my son Joseph Bland 5 Shillings. William Bland and James Bland whom I constitute the sole Exes of this my last will and testament in witness I have in the presence of these witnesses here unto set my hand and fastened my seal this the 19th day of March in the year of our Lord 1775 Signed, Sealed published and pronounced and declared by the said William Bland as his last will and testament in the presence of no who in his memory and in the presence of each other of us have here unto subscribed our names.  was appointed for me to die I will and wish my soul to the
 Lord and my body to the earth to be buried in Christian like
 manner and do here by make my last will and testament and by
 these presents do freely give and bequeath unto my true and loving wife
 Branch & Hepzibah Branch all and singular her land belonging to my estate
 lying below the mean path that leads from the main Road at the
 corner of James Gufford's field to the cross of the branches at the woolf
 field then north side of sd branch to the main marsh next to
 woolf field and the new ground with five negroes Viry, Sney, Silver
 Dell, Dick Lewis to have and to hold the sd said property during her
 life or widow hood after the same is to fall to my youngest son
 Benjamin Branch. Branch as follows runs a straight line from the
 to the crossing of the woolf branch thence down the west side of sd
 branch to the marsh so as to connect the head of the branch to
 the R. Bay also thence negroes Viry, Silver & Lewis. I also give &
 bequeath unto my wife beloved son Benjamin Branch all
 the lands of my estate lying above the woolf branch and
 from the crossing place of sd branch to the main road also
 a negro boy name Dick and also a certain bay horse also
 one half the stock and working tools from and after the death
 of the mother I also give and bequeath unto my beloved son
 Archibald Branch one negro boy name Sam & also give
 unto my daughter Polly Heathley two negroes Dell & Rose
 to him and to the heirs of his body. I also give & bequeath
