 thereto and at the same time Henry Allen and Lavin Allen the
 executors named in the said will came before the Court and
 qualified as executors thereto according to law and ordered
 that letters issued according to Just W^m Dickens C. C.

In the name of God amen. I Henry Allen of the state of North
 Carolina and County of Duplin being of perfect mind and
 memory Blessed be God calling to mind the uncertainty of
 Human life and knowing that it is just appointed for all men
 Henry to die. Do make and ordain this my last will and testament
 Allen in manner and words following. I give & command my soul
 to God that gave it to me and my body to have decent &
 Christian Burial at the discretion of my Executors here after
 named. Secondly I will and ordain that my Executor do sell
 so much of the most perishable part of my estate as may be
 sufficient to discharge all my just debts and funeral charges
 Thirdly I will and ordain to my son Henry Allen the full
 forth part of all the young cattle that are born out of my old
 stock of Cattle to him and his heirs forever. Fourthly I give and
 bequeath to my two sons Henry Allen and Lavin Allen to be
 equally divided betwixt them. Sheep and sheeps aside. all the
 cattle and hogs of my property & like wise all my house furniture
 and working tools to them and their heirs forever. Fifthly I give
 and bequeath to my son Williamson Allen twenty shillings
 currency to him and his heirs forever. Sixthly I give and bequeath
 to my son Ezekiel Allen twenty shillings to him and his heirs for
 ever. Seventhly I give and bequeath to my daughter Sabrough King
 Twenty shillings currency to her and to her heirs forever. Eighthly
 I give and bequeath to my daughter Ruth Jones Twenty shillings
 currency to her and her heirs for ever. Ninthly I give and be
 queath to my daughter Elizabeth Hally twenty shillings Curr

To her and her heirs for ever. Secondly I give and bequeath to my daughter Sarah Allen Twenty Shillings Cunway to her and her heirs for ever. Thirdly I give and bequeath to my daughter Rody Peacheay twenty shillings Cunway to her and her heirs for ever & lastly I nominate constate and appoint my two sons Henracy Allen and Leaven Allen Executors to this my last will and testament thereby revoking all others wills by me heretofore made he witness where of I the said Henracy Allen do have here unto set my hand and seal at Austin this the sixteenth day of July in the year of our Lord Christ one thousand seven hundred and ninety one and in the sixteenth year of the independence of America. And first I give my soul to almighty God that gave it and my body to the ground to be decently buried as my Executors here after named shall direct and as to the worldly estate that it hath pleased almighty God to bless me with after payment of my just debts I give and bequeath as follows in use first I give to my beloved wife Sarah the plantation wherewer I now live with all lands and appurtenances thereto belonging as also all my stock of every kind what so ever as also my house hold furniture during her life or widow hood and after death or ente manage to my son Timothy Atkinson and his heirs from But he the ¹⁰ Timothy being infirm & desirous in case he should die in his absence then to my son Thomas Atkinson and his heirs for ever item I give to my eldest son John Atkinson one shilling Sterling to be my alord by friend and for item I give to the heirs of my daughter Mary one shilling Sterling her portion being allmost paid item I give to my daughter Sarah one shilling Sterling she being already paid her part item I give to my daughter Rachel one black heifer of three years old and spring &c
