 Robert Southland Executors of this my last will
 and testament hereby revoking and annulling

In the name of God Amen. I Isaac Newton of the
 County of Deplin Calling to mind the mortality
 of my body and knowing that it is appointed
 for all men once to die, do make and ordain

this my last will and Testament, that is to
 say First of all I constitute and ordain Aaron
 Williams and Enoch Newton Executors of this my
 last will and Testament and as touching my
 world Estate I give and dispose of the same
 in the following form and manner first I give
 and bequeath unto my two sons Enoch and Isaac
 Newton's all my lands divided as followeth beginning
 at a Black Gum and Maple at the run off the
 swamp he now live on running thence S¹ 17th 18th
 poles crossing through the part of the plantation
 called the long field to a stake thence S¹ 10th 18th
 out to the back line all below this line to be
 Enoch Newton and all above to be Isaac
 Newton, and should either of these my sons
 die without a lawful begotten heir then and
 in that case all the my land to fall rest
 and remain to the other son that do still
 survive. In the next place I give and bequeath
 unto my son Isaac Newton my Negro girl called
 Grace and that her first child that shall live
 to be our month old be my son Enoch Newton.
 And that her second child that shall live to be
 our month old be my daughter Esther Newton.
 And that her third child that shall live to be our
 month old be my daughter Ann Newton. I also
 give and bequeath to my daughter Esther Newton
 one feather bed and furniture. — and I also give
 and bequeath to my daughter Ann Newton one
 feather bed and furniture. I also give to my
 son Enoch Newton one mare colt and all the
 hogs and sheep to be equally divided between Enoch
 Newton and Isaac Newton — and that Enoch Newton
 have our third of my stock of Cattle and Isaac
 Newton have the other two thirds of the cattle
 and that the mare and young horse be my son
 Isaac Newton. And that all my house hold
 furniture be equally divided among my four

youngest children and that all my plantation
lands be Equally divided between my two sons
Crock and Isaac Newton and as for those
of my children that have married, I leave
to them the following sums and no more
except my blessing. To Sarah Alderman five shillings.
To Rhoda Henning five shillings. To Mary Williams
five shillings. To Elizabeth Roney five shillings. To
Susan Morgan five shillings. To the heirs of my
two daughters Deacid Muriam Jones and Gemma
Wilson five shillings each, that is five shillings
to the heirs of Muriam and five shillings to the
heirs of Gemma. Excepting and reserving unto my
beloved wife Gemma Newton my home plantation
and all the above mentioned Estate during her widow
hood. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand
and seal this 19th day of November our Thousand
seven hundred and ninety eight. Signed Sealed
published and pronounced by the said Isaac
Newton his last will and testament in the
presence of us who in his presence and in presence
of each other have hereunto subscribed our names.
