There was the within will proved in open Court by the oaths  
 of D. Wright & John Bennett the subscribing witnesses and at  
 the same time Levy Skinner Term Bizzell & James Bizzell  
 qualified Esq to the will ordered that letters issue James Peacock 66  
 in the name of God Amen. I James Bizzell of the County of Duplin  
 and State of North Carolina being far advanced in years and  
 being in low state of health in body both of mind and  
 memory thanks be to God for the same and knowing that it is  
 appointed for all men once to day to die thought it would be best  
 to settle my worldly estate in which it has pleased God to bless  
 me with by will and I do by these presents do make and ordain  
 this my last will and testament and revoking all others by me  
 heretofore made and establishing this in manner and form following  
 James To Wit And first recommend my soul to God who gave it and  
 my body to the dust from whence it came and to be decently buried at  
 the discretion of my Executor herein after named & Secondly that all my  
 just debts which are very small and funeral charges should be paid  
 and the remainder of my estate to be divided as follows. To wit I leave to  
 my beloved wife during her life or widowhood all my lands and  
 plantation and the improvements on the west side of the main road  
 which my father gave to me. In addition to this I leave to her on the  
 east side of said road that part of the plantation from the negro  
 woman Tiller House street across the plantation nearly &  
 east course to hoop pole run all the cleared land north  
 of that line for six years and no longer. I also give her this  
 privilege for the gelling timber for the support of sd plantation of  
 the rest of my land and I give to my said wife all my house  
 hold and kitchen furniture and as many of the plantation tools as  
 she may need to her and her heirs forever to dispose of as she  
 thinks best and also my mare called Blage. I also leave to her  
 during her natural life all of my stock of cattle sheep & goats and  
 my negro Tom & Easter <sup>to be equally divided among them</sup> and at her death that part of said <sup>she</sup> ~~the~~ <sup>part</sup> ~~the~~  
 property which may be found there I give to my said three daughters  
 Betsy Maley & Alice. my negro woman Phillis and her three

children and their increase to be equally divided between them  
 to them and their heirs forever & give and bequeath to our son Samuel all  
 my lands and plantation in the east side of main road from the  
 mouth of the lane branch and with all branch to the corner of the  
 fence & with the main road to a mark post oak & then to leave  
 the road by the so side of a pond to Bowdins line and the land I  
 bought of Nicholas Bowdins to him and his heirs forever Except the six  
 years loan in a part of \$5 land to my sd wife & also give to my sd  
 son Samuel my negro boy Lake to him and his heirs forever &  
 also give to my son Samuel my negro boy Abraham on the condition  
 that he pays to my son Elijah Bizzell Four hundred and fifty  
 dollars on or before the twentieth of may in the year Eighteen hundred  
 & twenty six but if he fails so to do then in and that case I  
 give the said negro boy Abraham to my son Elijah Bizzell  
 Item I give and bequeath to my son James Bizzell all the rest  
 & remainder of my lands except the land I bought of James  
 Johnson the life estate left in said land to my wife only Ex-  
 cepted to him & his heirs forever & also give to my said son James  
 my negro boy Cealop and negro girl name Lucy to have and his  
 heirs forever. I also give to my son James my negro fellow George  
 provided he pays to my son William Bizzell <sup>Four hundred</sup> and fifty dolls  
 on or before the twentieth of may in the year eighteen hundred &  
 twenty six but shored he fail to do so then in and that case  
 I give the said negro George to my son William Bizzell I  
 also give to my son James my negro man Martin on these  
 conditions that pay to my daughter Nancy Gully three hundred dollars  
 on or before the 20th day of may in the year Eighteen Hundred &  
 twenty six but shored he fail to do so then in and that case  
 I give said negro man Martin to my said daughter Nancy Gully  
 and as I have give my sd son James <sup>a larger</sup> ~~Elijah~~ portion than the  
 rest of my sons I leave my deformed <sup>negro</sup> boy Joe to him with this  
 injunction that he maintain & support him during his life I give  
 and bequeath to my daughter Sally Dennis one land plantation  
 I bought of James Johnson to be sold and the sum of sd  
 sale to be appropriated in furnishing a negro girl for my  
 said daughter Sally Dennis to her and her heirs his forever  
 I give and bequeath to my daughter Catty Sanders five dolls  
 to her and her heirs forever I leave all my stock of horses

hogs coops of every description in the care of my Son James for the support of the family except three horses which I will to my then youngest daughters whenever they marry or otherwise need them the remainder of said stock or coop which may be over above sufficient for the support and maintenance of the family. I give to my son James to enable him to pay his brother William for George And Lassell \$<sup>1000</sup> dollars and appoint my son in law Levi Dennis and my son Samuel & James my Esqrs with full power & authority to act as such. Jacob Brown &<sup>son</sup> of Duplin County State of North Carolina being aged and infirm but of perfect mind and disposing memory do make and declare this my last will and testament in manner and form as follows. I give & bequeath my soul to the Almighty God who gave it and my body I submit to the dust from whence it came to be buried in a decent and Christian like manner at the discretion of my surviving friends. Inasmuch as I have given to my son Isaac Brown one negro man slave known by the name of Jack one bed and furniture also some cattle which is in full of his legacy of my estate then I have given to my daughter Polly mallard one negro girl known by the name of Nancy two feather beds & two Cows and calves which is in full of legacy of my estate. I have given to my son Stephen Brown one negro boy known by the name of Austin one bed and furniture and some cattle which is in full of his legacy of my estate. Then I have given to my daughter Sarah Willis one feather bed and furniture & two Cows & calves which is in full of her legacy of my estate. Then I give to my son Jacob Brown one negro man
