In the name of God Amen I James Pearsall of the State of North Carolina and county of Duplin being of sound mind and memory do make this my last will and testament in manner following first I give and bequeath to my wife Ann Pearsall during her natural life all her full right of common three hundred and twenty acres of land patented by Rev. Coates which I purchased from David Murdoch, to include my dwelling house and kitchen forty three acres of pine woods lying in front of the plantation which I purchased of John Jones patented by Joseph Jones - I also

give and bequeath to my said wife Ann one negro man named Jack one negro woman named Betty and one negro girl named Lucy my riding chair harness and horse to be of the choice of my horses and all my household and "Citcher" furniture to her and her heirs forever Next I give and bequeath all the lands that I possess in the County and also in the State of Tennessee unto my six sons viz Edward, James, Jeremiah, Jo, Dubson, Hugh, and William each Pearsall to be equally divided between them. Next I give and bequeath to my son Edward Pearsall one hundred dollars which is to be considered his full share of my personal estate together with three negroes one horse bed and other things which I have given him by deed of gift to him and his heirs forever. Next I give and bequeath to my daughter Mary Mc from the following negroes set by her same little son and her also sixty dollars in money which is to be considered as her share of my estate together with some other property given her that is not named to her and her heirs forever. Next I give and bequeath to my son James Pearsall my negro woman Nancy and my negro boy Arthur one man one bed and one hundred and fifty dollars in money to him and his heirs forever. Next I give and bequeath to my son in law James Mc from the two following negroes Slavery Bob and Bel one bed and some other articles already received. Next I give and bequeath to my daughter Elizabeth Pearsall my negro boy Art and negro girl Cate one hundred and fifty dollars in money and one feather bed and furniture. Next I give and bequeath to my soon youngest children (to wit) Anne, Jeremiah, Lucy James, Jo Dubson, Hugh, Turkey and William each Pearsall the twenty one following negroes: All senior, Charles, old Clew Penny young Clew Charlotte

Hagar Ben mums Daniel old Phellee Beck Wm
 young Daniel Sedia Jacob Henry selford young
 Phelis Rose Florence and Simon to be equally
 divided between them as they arive at lawfull
 age or remaries. Next I give and leave to my
 daughter Lucy Jane and Kirby Pearall
 one hundred dollar cash to be raised out of
 my estate by my executors Next my will and
 desire is in order that all my debts and
 funeral charges be paid that my executors do
 sell all my stock of every kind plantation tools
 and what provisions can be spent at six
 months credit and the - - - arising from
 such sale to be equally divided amongst all my
 children. Lastly I constitute and appoint my sons
 Edward Pearall and James Pearall and my
 friend James Hall and Thomas Mottor executors
 of this my last will and testament hereby revoking
 all former wills by me made in witness whereof
 I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 26th
 of September 1812. Signed sealed and declared to be
 the last will and testament of James Pearall in
 presence of S. Graham, Edw. Pearall, Henry Johnson.

 last will and testament in manner and form

 decent grave Second I give and bequeath to my
 Sister Kirby Pearall my Land in Duplin County
 on the following condition viz if she marries
 and has a living child to her and her heirs
 forever, and if she dont marry and have a child
 the Land at her death till which time she is
 to enjoy it) to be sold by my executors in such
 way as he may think best, and the money arising
 from the sale of the same, to be divided equally
 between my brothers and sisters herein after named
 Third, I wish my executors to dispose of (on such
 credit as he may think best) the balance of my
 property of every kind (my note excepted) and the
 money arising from such sale to be equally divided
 between my brother Jeremiah Pearall, Hugh Pearall
 and William D Pearall and my sister Ann
 Oliver and Lucy J. Pearall and they to enjoy
 the same than their and assigns four and should
 my sister Lucy Pearall die without a child or
 children they to enjoy the proceeds of my Land
 in Duplin than and than their and assigns
 forever. Fourth & last I nominate and appoint my
 brother Jeremiah Pearall Executor to and of this
 my last will and testament and for the trouble
 which he may be at in executing it I give to him
 the same than their and assigns four. In testimony whereof
 I have hereunto set my hand and seal this
 2nd day of April 1827. Signed sealed and published
 by the Testator, as his last will and testament.
