I give and devise and dispose of the same in the following Manner and form first of all I make and appoint my loving sons Isham and Ephraim Shollans. my true Executors to this my last will and testament. It is my will and desire that my whole Estate should be sold to the highest bidder in 'Months Credit to be given first I give to my beloved son Ephraim Sholan One hundred and Seventy Dollars which I collected, all my just debts to be paid. I also give to my beloved son Isham Sholan Seventy Dollars and after this an Equal Division to both please helim my three Heirs and I do hereby utterly disallow revoke and disannul and have other former Testaments Wills Legacies bequeaths and Exceeds by me in any wise before nows Willed and bequeath fortifying and Confirming this and no other to be my last will and testament in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal September 10th 1872

In the Name of God Amen August the first in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and sixty two I James Snell of Duplin County being very sick and weak in body but in perfect mind and memory thanks be given to God thus giving to mind the Mortality of my body and knowing that it is appointed for me once to die make and ordain this my last will and testament that is to say principally and first of all I give and Recommend my Soul into the hands of God that give it and for my body I Recommend to the Earth to be buried in a Christian like and decent manner at the discretion of my Executors nothing doubting but at the general Resurrection I shall receive the same again by the Mighty Power of God touching my worldly Estate wherewith it has pleased God to bless me in this life I give devise and dispose of the same in the Manner and form first I Impriam I give and bequeath to my well beloved wife Elizabeth Snell my negro boy named Ned to her and her Heirs and my Horses and Mares and my Cattle and my Tools and my bed and furniture and all the rest of my Household Goods and furniture that I have had here in my possession to her and her Heirs. Item I give the Child that my wife is now big with my negro boy named Ben of the Child his title and Corner of age and of the Child which is born it comes of age I give the said Negro to my well beloved brother Roger Snell for his Morn. I give to the Child as my wife is now big with one thousand and fifty acres of Land lying on the East side of the Six runs Swamp below Abraham Hennis joining to Abraham Hennis Land. Item I give to my well beloved Brother Roger Snell my Negro fellow Ben and all the rest of my Estate that is now in my Mother's hands to him and his after her decease and I likewise constitute make and ordain Roger Snell and George Bell my only and sole Executors of this my last will and testament and I do hereby

A Memorandum of the desires of William Thomas on his
death Bed To wit. He desires that his son John Thomas
should have the mainer plantation containing one hundred
acres. He also desires that his son Benjamin Thomas
should have the plantation that is Benjamin was
living on with the land belonging to the S. George. He
also desires that his hand sons Epheus Clark and
Lawrence Thomas should have five hundred acres
of land lying on the waters of Suttons to be equally divided
between his ~~sons~~ the S. Epheus and Lawrence. He
also desires that all his stock of Cattle should be
equally divided between his children June 11th 1785.
This day the under subscribed witnesses came before me
made oath that the above written was the last Will and
Testament of William Thomas devise on his death Bed June 9th 1785

from Robert Merrill which is Forty Pounds ten shillings & the
money he owes me which is six pounds

Item It is my desire that the money due me for my lands from Long
Island should be laid out with in the purchase of other lands
and that my beloved wife Epheus Underhill have a quiet and
peaceable possession of it the life time and then to be
equally divided between my two sons Joseph Underhill
and Jerry Underhill

Item I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Epheus Underhill
all the rest of my property that has not already been named
also the care of my Negro Girl Lusa during her natural life

Item I give unto my son in law William Underhill five shillings.

Item I give unto my daughter Sarah Underhill five shillings

Item I give unto my Anna Underhill five shillings

And I hereby make and ordain my beloved wife Epheus
Underhill and my worthy friend John Goss and William
Palmer Executors to this my last Will and Testament
In witness whereof I the said William Underhill have written
my last Will and Testament by my hand and seal the day
and year above written. Signed sealed published addressed
by the said William Underhill the Testator as his last
