In the name of God Amen. I Bryan Glisson of the
 County of Duplin and State of N^c Carolina. Being in a low
 State of health but of sound and perfect mind and memory &
 knowing that it is appointed for all men to die do make &
 ordain this to be my last will and testament in the manner
 as follows viz: First. my soul to the Almighty God who gave
 it me. Second my body to be Buried at the Cross Roads in
 a decent Christian manner at the discretion of my Executors.
 And then after all my worldly debts and funeral expenses be
 paid the remainder of my property be distributed in the
 following manner. First. I give and bequeath to my
 wife Sally Glisson ten cents also I lend to her during her
 life time or widowhood two hundred & forty acres of land
 where Joseph Walker now lives and one quarter more by the name
 of Dove then after her death or marriage I give the said
 land and more to my son Abraham Glisson & his heirs
 for ever with the Quarters of the more. Second. I give and
 bequeath to my daughter Golphia Ann Glisson ten cents
 to her and her heirs for ever. Thirdly. I give and bequeath
 to my son Bryan H. Glisson ten cents to him and his heirs
 forever. Fourthly. I give and bequeath to my two younger
 daughters Sally Jean Glisson and Susannah Glisson the two
 deep land and the Cross-road land and the Lube Spring
 land containing by estimation in all three pieces eight
 hundred and eight acres. Also six cows to be put out on
 Stocks on their lands which property to be divided equally between
 the two - also I give Sally Jean one feather bed and furniture.
 Fifthly. I give to my brother Abraham Glisson the sum of

one hundred and fifty dollars in cash. Sixthly. I give
 and bequeath to my Brother Stephen H. Glisson the sum
 of one hundred dollars in cash. Seventhly. I give and
 bequeath to Bryan Cherry the Son of W^m Cherry the
 sum of sixty dollars for my Executors to buy him
 said Bryan a horse. Eighthly I give and bequeath to
 W^m B. Komegay the Son of George F. Komegay the sum
 of fifty dollars to be put in his fathers hands to buy
 him a horse. Ninthly. I then leave all the rest of
 my property that shall be found after the legacies
 be given up to be sold and and equally divided between
 my three youngest Children. Tenthly. My wearing
 cloaths to be equally divided between my two brothers
 Abraham and Stephen H. Glisson. Lastly for my Executors
 I do nominate and appoint my brothers Abraham
 Glisson and Stephen H. Glisson. Nothing to debar this
 from being my last will and testament revoking
 all other former wills and testaments in witness where-
 unto. I have hereunto set my hand and fixed my seal
 this second day of August 1824. Witnesses present Samuel
 Davis. David Alburtson.

 One thousand Seven hundred and Seventy four. I Jeremiah
 Holden of the County of Duplin North Carolina, being
 very weak and sick in Body but of perfect Mind &
 memory. Thanks be given unto God; Therefore Calling to
 mind the Mortality of my Body and knowing that it is

appointed for all time here to live, I do make and ordain
 in my last Will and Testament, That is to say principally
 and first of all. I give and recommend my soul into the
 hands of Almighty God that gave it, and my Body I
 recommend to the Earth to be buried in decent Christian
 burial at the discretion of my Executors; not doubting
 but at the general Resurrection I shall receive the same
 again, by the mighty power of God and as touching such
 worldly Estate wherewith it hath pleased God to bless me
 in this Life. I give devise and bequeath of the same in
 the following manner and Item. Imprimis. I give and
 bequeath unto my beloved son Alexander Holden the
 Plantation wherein I now live with all Houses and
 Utensils thereunto belonging, and two Negro Sclaves named
 Dorian. Item. I do give and bequeath unto my Friend Jan
 Camble three cows and calves, one feather bed and furniture
 and the one? 3. Item I do give and
 bequeath unto my grand child John Holden one Negro which
 named Phillis. Item I give and bequeath unto my son-
 in-law Frederick Wells all my cloaths and wearing apparel.
 Item I do give and bequeath unto Frederick Wells Children, three
 cows and calves to each of them. Item I do give and bequeath
 the remaining of my Effects unto my loving son Alexander
 Holden aforesaid the whole to be managed and settled by
 Timothy Murphy and ? I do appoint constitute make and
 ordain my Executors of this my last Will and Testament. I do further
 ordain and desire that my son Alexander Holden aforesaid will
 pay off all my debts and be them to possess and enjoy all the
 remainder part of my Estate as before given, and granted him, and
 I do hereby utterly disallow, revoke, and disannul all and
 every other former Testaments, Wills, Legacies, and bequests,
 and Executors, by me in any way before named, made, and
 requested, Ratified, and Confirming this, and no other to be my
 last will and Testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto
 set my hand and Seal the day and year above written. —

 Bed and Sheet and blanket and one Chest. Item to
 my beloved daughter Rebecca Mills I give two beds
 and the Furniture to them belonging and the rest of my
 Puts and the remaining Part of my hogs. Item to my
 granddaughter Thankfull Mills I give eight barrels of
 Corn and the remaining part of the crop to my
 daughter Rebecca Mills. Item to my four youngest
 grandchildren, Mary Mills, James Mills, Shadrach Mills,
 and Frederick Mills. I give to each, one cow and calf and
 the remaining part of my cattle to Rebecca Mills. Item
 to my granddaughter Thankfull Mills I give all my sheep
 and the little pot and hooks and four Chairs. Item I
 give to my grandson James Mills and Shadrach Mills
 each of them one mair colt and the remaining Part of
 My horse kind to be sold and the money But to estimate
 and Equally divided in three parts giving James Mills and
 Shadrach Mills one third and the other two thirds to be
 divided between Mary Mills and Frederick Mills as they
 come of age to run it. Item I give to my granddaughter
 Thankfull Mills one hundred acres of land on the Broad
 Branch. Item I give to my grandson Shadrach Mills one
 hundred acres of land lying on the N^o Side of Lincolnton.
 Item I give to my grandson Hix Mills two Survey of land
 that joyneth the plantation I live on. Item I give to my
 granddaughter Thankfull Mills one Negro child named Lemia
 and the remaining part of My Estate after my just debts
 and funeral charges are paid I give My daughter Rebecca
 Mills and I do hereby ordain and appoint Robert
