This was the within proved in open Court in due form of law by the oath of Robert Bell and Lee Bell two of the subscribing witnesses thereto and at the sometime Thomas Coggins one of the Exs named in the said will came before the Court and qualified by taking the oath of an Executor according to law Ordered that letters may issue according to First Wm. Dicksons C.C. in the name of God Amen. I John Bell of the County of Duplin in the state of North Carolina being Bell very sick and weak but of sound mind & disposing memory thank to the almighty God for that and all other mercies confined upon me and being desirous to settle my worldly Estate as give and dispose of the same in manner and form following and first desire that my just debts and funeral expenses be first paid and provided. I give devise and bequeath to my son Thomas Bell the lower part of the land I live on to begin at the lower corner of the plantation and thence run a straight line to black Branch including all the lower part of said tract of Land to him his heirs and assigns for ever. Item I give devise and bequeath to my son Archibald Bell the upper part of the aforesaid tract of land beginning at the mouth of Great Branch & running a straight line up said branch to the back line to him his heirs assigns for ever. Item I give devise and bequeath to my son John Bell the remainder of the said land with the plantation and improvements to him his heirs assigns for ever. I give devise and bequeath to my said three sons all the rest and remainder of my lands to be equally divided amongst them their heirs and assigns for ever. Item I give and bequeath

to my daughter Ely with Bell Three cows and their calves to be paid her at the age or day of marriage which should first happen I give and bequeath to my wife my young horse called Prince Stone. I bind all the rest & remainder of my estate to my wife during her widow hood and afterwards to be equally divided to & amongst my afore said three sons & my daughter and lastly appoint Thomas Bogaw Hesekiah Bell and George Bell by Exes of this my last will and testament. In witness whereof the said John Bell hath here unto set his hand & seal this 6th day of May 1783. Signed, sealed published & declared by the testator to be and remain his last will & testament in the presence of Wm Robinson, Robt Bell, Jessie Bell
