 body but of sound and perfect mind and memory
 blessed be Almighty God for the same do make and
 publish this my last will and testament in manner
 and form following viz: first I give and bequeath unto
 my beloved wife Elizabeth Jones one bed and furniture and
 also all my household furniture that I do now possess
 and one cow and calf and one steer or heifer and horse
 valued at ten dollars and also my home and plantation

wherem I now reside, during her life only, and privilege
 of timber and fire wood and after her decease all to be
 equally divided between my son Timothy Green and my
 four Daughters. I do also give and bequeath unto my son
 Timothy Green three acres two ploughs two Iron wedges one
 pair one crosscut saw, one Gouge two shields three head
 of Cattle one sickle one rifle gun and (???). and also
 unto my son John Green I give and bequeath the
 sum of five shillings and unto my daughter Sarah
 Green one bed which she now claims and the furniture
 belonging to it also three head of Cattle and to my
 daughter Ann Green and the Lawfull begotten heirs of
 her body after her decease I give and bequeath one
 bed and furniture which she now has in possession +
 three head of Cattle and also unto my daughter Phoebe
 Green. I give and bequeath three head of Cattle, one
 bed and furniture also six head of sheep. And also unto my
 daughter Elizabeth Green I give and bequeath the bed
 which I bequeathed to her mother is to be in her part
 of her mothers dowry, and three head of Cattle two head
 of young hogs and my lands being one Hundred and
 fifty acres to be equally divided between my four
 Daughters my wifes lifetime excepted on the plantation
 and my daughter Anne a part thereof to her and the
 heirs of her body at her decease only she may dispose of
 it for her maintenance or her childrens and residue or
 remainder of my Estate to be equally divided between
 my wife my four Daughters and my son Timothy. But
