It is my desire that the — of land beginning at a corner set out at or near the old school house running some a straight line to Barren swamp joining all the S^d land between that straight line and the Thompson Branch should dispose off to discharge the debt due Mr McCall and if that should not be sufficient to discharge the said debt then all the S^d tract to be sold agreeable to the deed at the discretion of my Executor hereafter named and the surplus if any to go towards schooling my children. — It is also my desire if there should be a sufficient quantity of my estate sold to discharge all my just debts, that the following things be also sold to wit. two nift guns one grey horse and the English mare Pal, and I do hereby constitute and appoint Abraham Maltin and Henry Cannon to be my full and sole Executors of this my last will and Testament and I do hereby revoke and make void any other wills and Testaments by me heretofore made. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and fixed my seal this Twentieth Day of July Anno Domini one thousand seven hundred and twenty one. In the name of God Amen I John Maxwell of the County of Duplin and State of North Carolina being weak in body tho of perfect mind and memory thanks be given to God for the same, and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die do make and ordain this my last will and Testament in manner following (Viz). — first. I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Eliza two negroes named Sylvia and Harry my black mare and Bay Horse — my yoke of oxen and cart — four cows and calves — two head of sheep — my cupboard and furniture — three belonging — two good feather beds and furniture — six cows and pigs — thirty hogs two year old myt fall, and one hundred dollars to be raised out of my estate and provisions sufficient for herself and family for a year — I likewise give her my chair and table — one half of my kitchen furniture — half of my plows — hoes, axes and plantation tools — I give her my riding shawl and harness — and my hand mill, 2^d I give and bequeath to my step son Dickson Sloan my Bay filly foaled about last April. — 3^d I give and bequeath to my children Dolly Ann — Sarah — Henry and Margaret my negroes Beck — Dave — Chlo — Charly, Cade, Lony, Kitty and Balan — this part of S^d negroes as they arrive of age. I give and bequeath to my son Henry one hundred and fifty dollars to assist to educate him. I give and bequeath to my beloved wife one large wheel and cart — one tin wheel — and her riding saddle. The residue of my estate not given before, consisting of Notes, Bonds, Accounts &c. &c. I wish to be equally divided among my four children Dolly Ann — Sarah — Henry & Margaret. I constitute and appoint my good friend Joseph Gillispie my Executor to this my last will and Testament in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this 12th day of Dec 1813. In the name of God amen I Andrew M^c Intire of the County of Duplin planter, being sick and weak in body but of sound mind and memory, and calling to mind the uncertainty of this life, in that it hath pleased Almighty God to appoint a time for all men to die, do make and ordain this my last will and testament, in manner following that is to say first I leave & bequeath my soul to Almighty God, hoping for a favorable reception into the mansions of eternal Felicity, through the merits of Christ my Redeemer, and my body to be decently buried at the discretion of my Executors, and all my just debts justly discharged. Next I leave and bequeath unto my kinsman Andrew M^c Intire son of James M^c Intire all my lands and Improvements Eight negroes to wit Dorry, Harwich, Ireland, Sam, Little Cato Cassa Dennis and Cate together with all the rest of my Estate Real and personal not otherwise disposed of by this my last will and testament always reserving unto the said James M^c Intire the sole use and possession of all my lands and Improvements, together with the use of the aforesaid slaves untill the said Andrew M^c Intire, may arrive at the full age of twenty one years and the sole use or

possession of the manor plantation with the Improvements and the use of Dorry and Harwich for the term of his natural life, and further my will is that the said negro Ireland shall be hired out yearly by my Executors, for the term of seven years and the money arising from such hire to be applied to the express purpose, of Educating the said Andrew M^c Intire and the surplus if any shall be annually accounted for and paid to the said James M^c Intire. Next I leave and bequeath unto my niece Abella Clinton two negroes, to wit Luce and Bella our side saddle and all the cloaths, that belongs to my late wife. Next I leave and bequeath unto my brother James M^c Intire of the Kingdom of Ireland the sum of forty pounds sterling money, and to my sister Martha the like sum to be paid them or their heirs by my Executors, and in order to enable them as to do, my will that they dispose of in the usual manner Cato, and sell his wife my horse still and household furniture. And if this shall be found insufficient the balance to be made up from the hire of some of the negroes as may be judged most advantageous by my Executors and the said James M^c Intire. Next I leave and bequeath unto William Best five cows and calves and one good flather bed and furniture. Next I leave and bequeath unto James M^c Intire father of the said Andrew all the residue of my stock of every kind one young mare and all my —. And when the said Andrew shall not arrive at the age of twenty one years or leave no Lawfull issue my will is that the said lands and slaves shall be divided between the surviving heirs of the said James M^c Intire if any and that the manor plantation and its appurtenances shall remain to the sole use of the oldest male heir of the said James M^c Intire and lastly I constitute and appoint Robt Dickson,
