 Duplin County and State of N^o Carolina being in
 health and sound mind and memory and mindful
 of my mortality and uncertainty of my death make
 do my last will and testament in manner and
 form as followeth. and principally I recommend my
 soul into the hands of God that gave it me hoping
 to receive the same again at the general Resurrection
 and my Body I desire to be buried in Christian
 like manner at the discretion of my Executors
 hereafter named I shall therefore give as to my
 worldly goods and temporal estate which God has
 been pleased to bless me with I dispose of in the

following manner and form. Thus to my will
 beloved wife Emily Williams I bequeath and
 give during her life time or widowhood as
 follow. My Late Dwelling House with a
 third part of the manure plantation with
 two head of my horses such as she may choose
 at the time and four cows and calves with
 fore head of dry cattle four cows and pigs
 and hogs enough to make her -
 one feather bed and furniture and all my
 other household furniture as it then stands with
 all my plantation tools of every kind what
 ever all to be to her own use and benefit during
 her lifetime or widowhood for her support and to
 raise my children that remain with her at
 her decease or marriage to be divided of as
 will be after that. Thus I give and bequeath unto
 my Son James Williams one dollar besides what
 he hath already had to him and his heirs lawfully
 begotten forever. Thus I give and bequeath unto
 my Son Ezekiel Williams one dollar besides what
 he has already had to him and his heirs lawfully begotten
 forever. Thus I give and bequeath unto my
 son Samuel Williams one horse saddle & saddle
 and all the land that I now possess and
 two cows and calves and one feather bed bedstead
 and furniture one new pot three pew plates &
 half dozen of knives and forks to him and his
 heirs lawfully begotten forever. Thus I give and
 bequeath unto my daughter Emily Williams one
 dollar with what she has already had to her and
 her heirs lawfully begotten forever. Thus I give
