 to say each daughter Equal to each son as they come to
 age. my will and desire is also that my four youngest

 daughters last named Piggie Jobetha Patience and Rose
 have each of them all a horse and bed and furniture
 a piece then my will is after all my children has had
 their portion of a groable to what is intertained in
 the foregoing part of my will that the whole of the remaining
 part of my estate to be equally divided amongst the

 and my sons Francis Williams and Robert Williams
