be it in Body but of perfect sound mind memory and good memory
thanks Be to God for it, and calling to mind that it is important
for all men once to die do make and ordain this my last Will
and testament, first of all I Recommend my soul into the hands
of God that go-ve it, and my Body to be Buried in a Christian like
Manner of the Denomination of my Eccleson which I shall hereafter
appoint.

I leave to my well Beloved Wife Elizabeth Morley during her life
time or widow hood one Negro Man named Joe and his wife
& Calves one Cow and a pair of young Guinea pigs and at the death
of five pounds in Gold, one Horse named Saddle & Bridle or
Mancy & Be given to my Daughter Charlotte Morley to she and
her heirs forever

Item I give and Bequeath unto my Daughter Charlotte Morley
Three Negro Slaves named Dan, Noah, Jo and provide for
Daniel and five pounds in money to she and her heirs forever
to be paid in Gold & one Bay mare with two white feet.

Item I give and Bequeath unto my grand son William Morley
all the land that I possess on the North Side of Panther Swamp
in this County and fifteen acres and Calves and one
Hundred Silver Dollars to him and his heirs forever.
and one Negro Slave named Joney.

Item I give and Bequeath unto my grand son Almon Morley all
the lands and promises that I possess on the South Side
of Panther Swamp. Whereon I now live and one Hundred
Silver Dollars and one Negro Man named Friday one Red and
Guinea pig and fifteen pounds & Calves to him and his heirs forever.

I give and Bequeath unto my Daughter Sarah McKimson
Five pounds in Money to she & her heirs

I give and Bequeath unto my Daughter Mary Cherry Five pounds
in Money to she & her heirs

and the remainder part of my Estate to be sold and the
money to be Equally divided amongs to my Third Daughter
Sarah McKimson Mary Cherry and Charlotte Morley
likewise I leave my Son-in-law Robert Cherry daughter
Exe-cutor to this my last Will and testament in Witness

Whereof I, John Warley Kern, do unto set my hand

Eight Hundred and two, heaving unto mind the mortality of
my body and knowing that it is appointed for all men once
to die do move and ordain this my last will and testament that
is to say principally and first of all I give and bequeath
my soul into the hands of Almighty God that give and send
my body I bequeath to the earth to be buried in a decent Christian
burial at the discretion of my Executors nothing doubting at
the General Resurrection I shall see the same again by the
mighty power of God and as touching such worldly property
Wherewith it shall please God to bless in this life. I give devise
and dispose of the same in the following manner and form,
That all my lawful debts be paid out of my Estate as my heirs
and Executors shall see fit for them.

I give and bequeath to Elizabeth Halds my lawful wife all my
land Negroes with their issue as well as my house and other

plantation tools and house hold furniture or any thing else
that I have or claim in any way as mine or mine to be
used and disposed

3rdly I do hereby make and ordain my worthy friend.
of this my last will and testament

4thly I do hereby utterly disallow revoke and disannul all every act
former Testaments Wills Legacies Bequests and of gifts and
Executions by me in any way before made and and by me
ratify my and confirming this and no other to be my last will
and testament in witness whereof I the said Joseph Hald
have to this my last Will and Testament set my hand and Seal
the day and year above written.
