 the land that they if they see cause let them have the benefit and discharge  
 let stand to the damage of it it is advised that all to raise my  
 youngest son with is to be taken out of the price of the plantation or out of the  
 rents of it and I desire also if the place is sold that the price be equally  
 divided between the three boys. I do constitute and appoint my cousin  
 Gilbert Clark living on Barbours creek south side of the North and  
 Archibald & John Clark my sons to be my sole executors to execute the  
 my last will and testament according to the true intent and  
 meaning thereof I do like wise order that my children shall have nothing  
 according to my wife shall see proper and my son pay for his bearing  
 out of his money as witnesses my hand this day and year of them written
