Proved in Court the 12<sup>th</sup> May 1861 by the oath of John Yarborough. Registered in the Registration office in Duplin County in Lib<sup>o</sup> 6 Folio 127 by me John Bird Reg<sup>r</sup>  
 In the name of God this fifth day of July in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred and sixty one I John Bird  
 of Duplin County being very sick & weak in body but in perfect mind & memory thanks be given to God. Wherefore calling to mind the mortality of my body and knowing that it appertaineth for all men once to die I do make and ordain this my last will and testament that to  
 say principally and first of all I give & recommend my soul to  
 th unto the hands of God its giveth and for my body I recommend to  
 the earth to be buried in a Christian like manner at the discretion  
 of my Exes nothing doubting but at the general resurrection I shall  
 have the same again by the mighty power of God almighty world  
 estate herewith it has pleased God to bless me in this life. I give and leave  
 to my son in name & fame viz Benjamin D. Burrough and bequeath  
 to my beloved son John Bird one hundred acres of land with  
 the plantations wherein I now live and one negro boy name Tyle an
