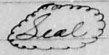


In the name of God Amen I Joseph Wade

in the year of our Lord one thousand seven
hundred and ninety four, make and publish
this my last will and Testament, in manner
following that is to say, First I give and
bequeath unto my Loving Wife Mary all my
Estate real and personal as long as my wife
is able to keep House and to have a child's
part where she is not able to keep House (Exempting)
Three Cows to my Daughter Dicey Driley and
Elizabeth, secondly after my wife is past housekeeping
my will is that my plantation with all the stock
and Household Furniture be sold at Twelve Months
Credit and divided amongst my daughters and
James Wade my Grand son Equally alike.
Thirdly I will and bequeath to my three sons James
Joseph, and Samuel Wade three shilling currency
apiece and I hereby make and obtain my worthy
Friends John Bradley and Lewis Watkins executors
to this my last will and Testament in witness
whereof I the said Joseph Wade have to this my
last will and Testament set my hand and seal
the day and year above written.

Then I will and bequeath to my daughter Susannah
Freeman one equal part with my other Daughters (Exempting)
the same &c thus this is by way of a Codicil before the
signing Sealing of these presents.

negroes I leave to my sisters Equally, Elizabeth Cottle

leave my young girl to Edward Houston son of
William Houston, I leave forty dollars to Edward
Houston son of penny Houston and I hereby make
and obtain my mother Temperance Williams and
Gonz B Houston Executors of this my last will &
Testament in witness whereof I the said Edward
Williams have to this my last will and Testament
set my hand and seal this day and year above
