Then I give unto my beloved son Samuel Green one Cow and calf. — I then give unto my beloved daughter Ann Williams one two year old steer. It will be understood that I have given my daughter Martha Rubenokah and Elizabeth all that I intend for them. — Then I hereby constitute and appoint my friends Benjamin Fussell and Stephen Williams my Executors to this my last will and testament.
