In the name of God Amen. This thirteenth day of
May in the year of our Lord one thousand
seven hundred and ninety six, I Luke Ward
of the County of Duplin and state of the Carolina
being sick of Body but of perfect mind and
memory thanks be to god, and calling to mind
that it is appointed for all men to die.

Do make this my last will and testament in
manner following. First, I recommend my
soul to the hand of god who first gave it to
me. Secondly, my body to be decently buried
at the discretion of my Executors that will be
hereby hereafter named. Thirdly, all my lawfull
Debts to be justly paid. Thus I give and bequeath
to my beloved wife Bridget Ward during her
widowhood or natural life all my estate real
and personal. Thus I give and bequeath to my
son Luke Ward at his nothins death or intermarriage
all my Land or Right or Claim of Lands to him
and his lawfull Heirs forever providing
he the said Luke Ward shall first unto his wife
Prancy Ward a part of said dwelling house and
forty acrs. of cleared land during her being
unmarried and if he dies without a lawfull
Heir then said land to be equally divided between
my two daughters Prancy Ward and Elizabeth Pollards
and their lawfull Heirs forever. Thus I give and
bequeath to my daughter Prancy Ward two young negroes
named Bob and Harwood. Thus I give and bequeath
to my daughter Elizabeth Pollards two other negroes
named Sam and Jack to her heirs and if she dies
without Heirs then to Luke Ward and his heirs.
Thus I give and bequeath to my daughter Prancy

Ward one bed and furniture one chest and case
Thus all the remaining part of my property
to be divided between my six children
where each shall alike to three each their
heirs. Thus I constitute and appoint my
loving wife Bridget Ward and my son Luke
Ward Executors of this my last will and
testament. Last I Publish and declare this
my last will and testament disannulling and
revoking all others wills or Legacies by me
made herebefore in witness whereof I have hereunto set
my hand and seal the day and date above
written.
