Gertrude) Whereas Zachariah Sandcloth & Sapler County, Sarah Sandcloth both made oath upon the Holy scriptures of Almighty God that Thomas Williams deceased left to my upon his death bed but in his proper sense that Charles Miller should have all his things at his decease. Done to before me John Williams Esquire October 26th day 1770.

In the Name of God Amen. I Robert Wilkinson of Groce County widow being wife of body free of mind and perfect mind and memory praise be God for the same do make this my last will and testament in manner and form following. First and principally I command my soul into the hands of Almighty God my creator hoping through the merits of Jesus Christ to obtain pardon and remission of all my sins and to inherit everlasting life and my body I commit to the Earth to be decently buried at the discretion of my Executors hereinafter named in the county of Franklin as near to the bodies of my late dear husband and child as conveniently may be I command. I will order and direct that all such just debts as I shall owe at the time of my decease shall be paid and satisfied and wheresoever seized in law of and in public lands houses and improvements to me for work and labor done by Robert German late of Groce County living and being near Larchmont Swamp now in occupation of John German son of the late Robert. I give above and bequeath the same to my

son David Salmon his heirs and assigns forever. Item I give and bequeath unto my said son David Salmon one beg one cow and three head cattle which is at my place a spinning wheel and steel and cable at John German house forty shillings four barrels of corn seven yards of Linen two pairs of stockings all left to me by the last will and testament of the said Robert German. Item I give and bequeath to my said son David Salmon one cow and calf and while over Horses with the first calf a stall a gelding Horses while backed a large breed of Horses with increase forever. Item I give and bequeath unto my granddaughter of my son Richard Burnell at Lynden Creek all my body apparel that is today over Calicoes Gown over Country Cloth Gown one blue and white calico gown a black silk Crepe Petticoat and four yards of silk blue Camby a pair of worsted stockings spans of horse span stockings a blue cloth and one silk and there also is that my said Executor and Trustees their expenses herein Executors or Administrators shall not be charged or chargeable with or accountable or or responsible for or liable to make good any loss that shall happen in the management or disposal of my estate or any part thereof. He and they respectively acting bona fide and according to the best of his and their discretion. Item I nominate constitute and appoint my good friend William Houston sole Executor of this my last will and Testament and Lastly I do hereby revoke all former and past wills and legacies by me at any time heretofore made bequests or gifts and in writing and declare the only be my last will and Testament for witness whereof I the said Robert Wilkinson the Testator have to this my last will and Testament set my hand and seal this 27th day of August Anno Domini 1761. of the Province of North Carolina and County of
Duplin Planter, being of sound mind and
memory to God for the same let witness to my
last writing of my body recovery that I do appy
Let all men know to die as Christians make +
ordain this my last will and Testament in
manners and form following way. Principally
first of all give my soul into the hands of Almighty
God that gives it me and my body to the earth
to be buried in a decent Christian burial at the
discretion of my Executors hereafter named nothing
bothering least at the general resurrection I shall
receive the same again by the mighty power of
God. And as touching next worldly Estate as it
pleases God of His ---- manis to leave me
with in this life & so disposed of in the following
manners and forms. First I will that all my just
debts and funeral charges be cleared and discharged.
Item - I do give and bequeath to my son John
Ward one Cow and Calf and all that I have given
him that he may have to him and his heirs
forever. Item. I do give and bequeath to my son John
Ward our Cow and Calf our feather bed and bolster our
dish and Spoon and two plates all now in his
possession to him his heirs forever. Item I do give
and bequeath to my son John Ward our Cow
and Calf our feather bed + our bolster our
dish our Spoon and two plates to him and his
heirs forever. Item I do give and bequeath to my

Daughter Sarah Ward our Cow and Calf our
Cow and Calf in our Eastin house they and
their increase two ewes and Lambs they and
their increase one feather bed + bolster + blanket
and bedding our large pot our chest our iron
box and heaters, our Linen sheet, our wallet
wheel and our small trunk, one desk, our basin
and two plates our water tankard our dog
two cups and saucers + two cans and pigs to
she and her heirs forever. Item I do give and
bequeath to my wife Beloved wife Jane Ward our
feather bed and furniture and instead our chest
our large black leather saddle Bridle and Girth,
our plow and gun our scythe horse, saddle,
Bridle and halter our plow and gun our carts
and wheel our Linen sheet our pot and frying
pan two narrow eyes, our broad as to wedding
hairs, our grubbing hoe all the rest of my furniture
not yet mentioned, all out of my cattle house
and sheep, not yet mentioned + all my guns, and
all the rest of my Estate not herein mentioned,
also the place taken where I now live I land her
during her natural life to she and her heirs for
ever. Item I do give and bequeath to my son
John Ward 3 part of the plantation whereof I now
live beginning on a Chestnut oak in Smith's
Swamp and running along a row of marsh
trees to a great pine near a small Branch thence
the same course to the branch thence up the
branch to the head to the head line thence along
the I have to Smith's swamp thence down the
various courses of the swamp to the beginning to
Linn and his heirs (after my wife's death) four.
Item I do give and bequeath to my son John Ward
for (after my wife's death) the remainder of my
land and plantation. To Linn and his heirs forever.
And further I do appoint my beloved wife Jane
Ward and my son John Ward Executors of this my
