In the name of God Amm. I Robert Knowles of  
the County of Duplin being my wife in body  
but of perfect mind and memory, thanks be  
given to god, calling to mind the mortality of my  
body, and knowing that it is appointed for all men  
once to die; do make and ordain this my last will  
and testament; that is to say principally and first  
of all, I give and recommend my soul into the  
hand of Almighty God that gave it and my body I  
recommend to the earth to be buried in decent  
Christian burial, at the discretion of my Executors:  
nothing doubting, but at the general resurrection I  
shall receive the same again by the mighty  
power of God. And as touching such worldly estate  
wherewith it has pleased God to bless me in this  
life, I give devise and dispose of the same in the  
following form and manner. First I give and  
bequeath to Elizabeth my dearly beloved wife  
all my movable property together with the full  
possession of my lands and plantation all of which  
to be used toward the support of her and my children  
during her continuing my widow or until the  
children becomes of age, and then for the land to  
belong to Emanuel and James and all the movable  
property that is then to be found to be equally  
divided between Francis, Elizabeth and William, I  
likewise appoint and constitute James Knowles

and Stephen Williams Executor to this my last  
will and testament I in witness whereof I have  
hereunto set my hand and seal this 21<sup>st</sup> April  
1792. Signed, Sealed, published, pronounced, and  
declared by the said Robert Knowles as his last will  
and testament in the presence of six, who in their  
presence, and in presence of each other, have

recollecting that it is once appointed for all to die  
do ordain and constitute and make this my last

to wit. And first of all I commit my body to the  
dust from whence it came recommending my soul  
unto the hands of Almighty god who gave it first.  
1<sup>st</sup> I give to my beloved son Bryan Hornigay one  
negro man name Jimm one negro boy Adam  
one negro boy Mas. 2<sup>nd</sup> I give to my beloved  
son Henry Hornigay one negro woman Lucy and  
her two children Sun and Jim one negro girl Casey  
one negro girl Rachel. 3<sup>rd</sup> I give to my daughter  
Penelope James one negro man Jim one negro girl  
Suffey one negro girl Agnes. 4<sup>th</sup> I give to my daughter

Mary Caraway one negro woman Sally and her child Charles, one negro boy George to her and her heirs for ever. 5<sup>th</sup> I give to my beloved grand children to wit Mary, Maria, Nancy Jones, Zachariah Komigay and Henry Komigay, wady Komigay and Martha Komigay the sum of one hundred dollars to each of them and also one dollar to Lucy Blaylock and each of these above mentioned grand children to wit Mary Jones, Nancy Jones, Zachariah Henry, Harde Martha and Lovy when they arrive at the age of twenty one year they are to receive the above sums are to be paid by my executor. I do hereby constitute and nominate and appoint my beloved and trusty sons Bryan and Henry Komigay as executors to this my last will and Testament given under my hand and seal this the 10<sup>th</sup> day of September in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty six. Signed, Sealed, and acknowledged in the presence of us, Charles Williams, W<sup>o</sup> Williams.

 being weak in body but of perfect mind and sound  
 memory knowing it is appointed for all men once  
 to die do make and ordain this to be my last will  
 and Testament, first I recommend my soul to God  
 who gave it and my body to be decently buried by my  
 Executor hereafter named and as to such worldly goods

as it has been pleased Almighty God to bless  
 me with I dispose of as follows. First, I give and  
 bequeath to my son George Komigay beside the  
 land he lives on and the other property he has  
 already received with the negroes Tony and Charles  
 Bobi Haner and Cato to him and his heirs. Item  
 I give unto my daughter Lively and her husband  
 John Komigay one mare and saddle one bed  
 and furniture and four cows and calves, all of  
 which they have personally used. I also lend unto  
 S<sup>r</sup> Luell and her husband John the following  
 negroes (viz) Esther and all her children and one  
 boy named Jack during my life this my will and  
 desire is that S<sup>r</sup> negroes be under the care of  
 my son Daniel and the profits, arising from them  
 to be applied to the support of S<sup>r</sup> Luell during  
 her life and after her decease the whole of S<sup>r</sup> Negroes  
 to be equally divided amongst her children. Item I  
 give and bequeath to my son Daniel Komigay beside  
 the land he lives on and the other property he has  
 with the negroes Jimmy and Lacey and all her children  
 which he has in possession one boy named Jim and  
 three cows and Hifers and yearling to make six head  
 to her and her heirs forever. Item I give and bequeath  
 to my son David Komigay beside the land he lives  
 on, the following negroes that he has in possession  
 viz, Violet, Will, Gus and little Lou and a boy named  
 Mathew and one hundred Dollars in money to him  
 and his heirs. Item I give and bequeath to my two  
 sons Barel and Jacob Komigay all the residue or  
 remainder of my negroes not hitherto mentioned in  
 the will to be equally divided between them the S<sup>r</sup>  
 Barel and Jacob or their heirs. Item. I give unto  
 my wife Mossem Komigay one horse named Sweep  
 and my riding chair to her and her heirs. My  
 will and desire fortune is that after all my  
 just debts be paid that my son Barel pay my  
 son Jacob five hundred Dollars out of my Estate
