I leave to my oldest son at y^t day of my wife's marriage or y^t day of her death and if rest of my lands i leave to be sold and divided equally amongst them John Brock and Daniel Joanes Esq. There was the within will proved in open Court in due form of law by the oath of Donallay Gov one of the subscribing witnesses ordered the Clerk certifie the same that letters may issue according First Law No^t 2nd December 1776. In the name of God Amen. I Moses Boyt of Draplin County & State of Boyt North Carolina. am sick and weak in body but in perfect sense and sound memory do make and ordain this my last will and testament - this the fifth year Independence one thousand seven hundred and eighty. Item I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Anne Boyt one horse bridle and saddle one feather bed and furniture. My land and plantation

to her during the time that she chooses to continue theron during her lifetime also one cow & calf and one mare — to believe her & my son Arthur Hearn I give and bequeath unto my dear son & brother Boyce all my lands and plantation one year old colt — one cow & calf one two year old heifer one feather bed and furniture. Item I give and bequeath to my dear daughter Abigail Stevens one Shilling Sterling Duplin the twenty-eighth 1280 in presence of Thomas Livingston Jonathan Fox Christopher Martin Moses ^{no} & Boyce mark

In the name of God Amen this day being the second day of July one thousand seven hundred & sixty two I William Bright of Duplin County North Carolina being sick and weak of body but of proper mind and memory shrinking to give to God hereafter calling to mind the mortality of our body and that is appointed for all men once to die do make & ordain this my last will and testament that is to say principally I first of all recommend my soul unto the hand of God that gave it hoping for pardon & the remission of sins thro the merits and intercession of my Lord and savior Jesus Christ Bright and my body to the ground to be buried at the discretion of my executors hereafter named nothing doubting but at the general resurrection and at the last day I shall again be raised from the dead by the mighty power of God and as touching my world estate wherewith it has pleased God to bless me with in my life time I — and bequeath the same as follows First my will & desire to pay all my debt after my funeral charges is paid. Item I give to my son & law John Winder two feather beds. Item I give to my son in law Stephen Hearing one feather bed also. It are I give to my sons in law John Winder & Stephen Hearing all my hole estate that is not mentioned to be equally divided between John Winder and Stephen Hearing Likewise I also leave John Winder & Stephen Hearing my sole executors to this my last will and testament signed sealed and delivered in the presence of us.
