 shunt. ordered the clerk certify the same that — letters
 may issue according Just James M^r Dickson & Co. In the
 name of God Amen. I Moses Boyitt of Duplin County & State of
 North Carolina. am sick and weak in body but in perfect sense
 and sound memory do make and ordain this my last will
 and testament - This the fifth year Independence one thousand
 seven hundred and eighty. Item I give and bequeath to
 my beloved wife Anne Boyitt one horse bridle and saddle
 one feather bed and furniture. my land and plantation

to her during the time that she chooses to continue thereon during her
 lifetime also one cow + calf and one mare ——— to William her +
 my son Arthur Nam I give and bequeath unto my dear son Arthur
 Boyet my all my lands and plantation one year old colt — one cow +
 calf one two year old heifer one feather bed and furniture. I then I
 give and bequeath to my dear daughter William Stettins one shilling
 Sterling Duplin Co the twenty-sixth 1780 in presence of James
 Loringan Jonathan Fore Christoph Martin Moses ^{his} Boyet
 mark

In the name of God Amen this day being the second day of
 July one thousand seven hundred + sixty two I
 William Bright of Duplin County North Carolina being sick
 and weak of body but of proper mind and memory sheweth to
 given to God therefore calling to mind the mortality of my body
 and that is appointed for all men once to die do make + ordain
 this my last will and testament that is to say principally. I
 first of all recommend my soul unto the hand of God that
 gave it. hoping for pardon + the remission of sins thro the
 merits and intercession of my Lord and savior Jesus Christ
 and my body to the ground to be buried at the discretion of any
 of my Exors hereafter named, nothing doubting but at the general
 resurrection and at the last day I shall receive it again
 by the mighty power of God and as touching my worldly estate whereto
 it has pleased God to bless me with in my life time I ——— and
 bequeath the same as follows. First my wife + desire to pay all my debts
 after my funeral charges is paid. Then I give to my son in law
 John Winden two feather beds. Nam I give to my son in law
 Stephen Hearing one feather bed also. I then I give to my sons in
 law John Winden + Stephen Hearing all my hole estate that is
 not mentioned to be equally divided between John Winden and
 Stephen Hearing. Likewise I also leave John Winden + Stephen
 Hearing my sole Exors to this my last will and testament
 Signed Sealed and delivered in the presence of us. Test.
