 children. Lastly I constitute and appoint
 my friends David Hills and Solomon Pigford
 as Executors to this my last will and Testament
 Rescinding all other wills heretofore made by me
 the S^d Timothy Pigford. In testimony here of
 I have set my hand and seal at Duplin the
 24 day of June in the year of our Lord 1823.

In the name of God amen. I Patric Powell
 of the Province of North Carolina and county
 of Duplin being sick of body but perfect in
 mind and memory for which I bless God. Therefore
 the twenty second day of July in the year of
 our Lord our Thousand Seven hundred and Sixty
 nine. Having taken into my serious and mature
 consideration that it is appointed for all men
 once to die and after death doth look and

also expect a general Resurrection in and through
 my Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ; and through
 his merits and meditations do look for and
 rely upon him for eternal Salvation and therefore
 doth recommend My body to the Earth to be buried
 in a decent and Christian manner at the
 discretion of my Executors whom I shall hereafter
 name, and also doth recommend my soul to
 God that gave it and for what worldly substance
 God hath blessed me with I leave will and
 bequeath as follows viz: First. I will &
 bequeath to my oldest son George Powell the
 land and plantation where I now live to be his
 and his heirs and assigns for ever, and to devolve
 into his peaceable possession when he comes to
 age and not before but the rest of my children
 shall have an equal share of S^d land and plantation
 to help them for an maintenance to such
 turn as he my son George comes to age and
 then S^d land and plantation shall all devolve
 to him as aforesaid. Item I leave and bequeath
 the one third of all my moveable effects viz:
 horses cows swine sheep and all other
 my house hold effects and furniture of every
 kind whatsoever together with all my debts
 owing to me with all compliments of farming
 whatsoever after my lawfull debts and funeral
 expenses is first paid, to my well beloved wife
 Mary Magdalen Powell. Item I again leave &
 bequeath the other two thirds to be equally
 divided amongst my four children now in being
 and likewise the child that that my wife is
 now big of shall have an equal share of the
 aforesaid two thirds with only my other four if
 it should please God that it comes alive to
 the world and live to enjoy the same — and
 if it should please God that any of all my
 children should die before they come to age

that them and in such case that our share shall be equally divided amongst the surviving children, Likewise it is my will and I order that my wife and children shall all live together upon this my plantation to such times as my wife shall marry if it please God that son she should marry But in case she marry then she shall have no longer right to live here But my plantation shall be employed to the maintenance of the children to such times as my son George comes to age then it is his as afore said. Likewise it is my will that all my children and my wife make no division but all live together to such times as my wife should marry or that the children shall come to age then as they come to age give them all their share and if my wife marry give her all of her share. Likewise I ordain and appoint my beloved wife ~~Lizzy~~ Mary Magdalen Powell and Alexander Todd my Executors to this my last will and testament. Also I order and appoint Robert Dickson overseer and guardian to see my children justly delt with agreeable to this my last will and testament &c. by these presents I declare this my last will and testament revoking all other wills and testaments made by me either in words or writing and then only to stand. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and find my seal the day and year first above above written &c. Signed Sealed published and declared in the presence of us. In the Name of God amen December 12th 1820. This my last and solemn will & testimony. That my state of bodily health at present is very low. Yet in my perfect mind I am not the least addled or doted. I give and bequeath all my possession of Land on the east side of the new Road to my son Wiley after the death of his mother including the manure plantation. I give and bequeath all the land I possess lying between the new road and old road to my son Sampson after the death of his mother I give and bequeath all my Land lying over the old road on the west side of said to my son Hugh. N.B. Should either of my two youngest sons die before he comes of age his youngest brother shall have his share of land. I loan to my son Alexander the bed he lays on and furniture during his life time and \$25 left in the hands of my Executor at his disposal. I give and bequeath to my daughter Mary \$5 all the stock both consisting of cattle and hogs on my primeur marked with a snore crop in the right ear I disclaim I give and bequeath them to my son Hugh one cow and calf one 2 year old heifer marked with a crop and slit half moon in the right ear. I give and bequeath to my son Wiley, one cow and calf and 2 year old heifer marked with a crop & slit and half moon in the left ear. I give and bequeath to my son George. I lend to Cytha my beloved wife 2 cows and calves one 3 year old heifer &
