I Peter Young of the State of North Carolina and County of Wayne being of perfect mind and memory blessed be God calling to mind the uncertainty of life and having it opposed that for all men once to die. Now and ordain this to be my last will and Testament in manner and form following Viz: First I bequeath my soul to God that gave it me and my body to God Christian like burial at the discretion of my Executors hereinafter to be named Secondly I will and ordain that as much of the perishable part of my property may be sold as will pay all my just debts and funeral expenses.

Thirdly. I give and bequeath unto my loving wife Jane Young one mair and one half of any Stock of Cattle and Hogs and Sheep and also my household furniture and plantation tools, & that his and hers forever.

Fourthly I give and bequeath to my Son James Young one hundred acres of land including the plantation wherein our house lives and one horse saddle & bridle and the one half of the remaining part of my Stock of Cattle Hogs and Sheep & household furniture and plantation tools to him and his heirs forever.

Fifthly I will and ordain that after my decease that the above mentioned Cattle Hogs and Sheep & household furniture of every nature and kind to be equally divided between the said Jane Young and my Son James Young.

Sixthly I will and ordain that my beloved wife Jane Young have peaceable and quiet possession on the plantation

I now live during her life.

Seventhly I give bequeath to my Son John Young Mair and Jane and Peter Young five shillings sterling each to them and their heirs forever.

Eighthly I will and ordain that my two daughters Margaret Brown and Ann Stanton have five shillings sterling each to them and their heirs forever.

Ninthly and last I bequeath and appoint my worthy friend Timothy Teasley as Executor to this my last will and Testament and my beloved wife Jane Young Executors in testimony hereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal my seal this 20th day of November 1799.
