I Peter Young of the State of North Carolina and County of  
Blount being of perfect Mind and Memory blessed by God  
calling to mind the uncertainty of life and knowing it impossible  
that for all men once to die. More and ordain this to be my  
last Will and Testament in manner and form following  
W<sup>t</sup>. First recommend my Soul to God that gave it me and my  
Body to live Christian like until at the Resurrection of my Saviour  
hereinafter to be named Secondly I will and ordain that as so  
Much of the perishable part of my property may be soe as will  
pay all my just debts and funeral Expences.

Thirdly I give and bequeath unto my loving wife Jane  
Young One Milin and one half of any Stock of Cattle and  
Hogs and Sheep. and also my house hold Furniture  
and plantation tools, & that her another forever

Forthly I give and bequeath to my Son James Young  
One hundred Acre of Land including the plantation  
wherein and now living and one horse saddle & Bridle,  
and the one half of the remaining part of my Stock of Cattle  
Hogs and Sheep. & house hold Furniture and plantation tools  
to him and his Heirs forever.

Fifthly I Will and ordain that after my decease that  
the said mentioned Cattle Hogs and Sheep & house hold  
Furniture of every Nature and Kind to be equally divided  
between the said Jane Young and my son James Young

Sixtly I Will and ordain that my beloved wife Jane Young  
have peaceable and quiet Possession on the plantation

& now live during her life.

Seventhly I give bequeath to my Sons John Young Nelson Young  
and Peter Young five Shillings Sterling each to them and  
and their Heirs forever

Eighthly I will and ordain that my two daughters Margaret  
Brown and Ann Blanton here give Shillings Sterling each  
to them and their Heirs forever

Ninthly And last I constitute and appoint my neather friend  
Timothy Teachey as Executrix to this my last will and testamant  
and my beloved wife Jane Young Executrix in testimony  
hereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal my seal this  
20<sup>th</sup> day of November 1799
