son to be my Exrs to this my last will + testament hereby revoking  
all other wills heretofore made by me in witness whereof I have

In witness it is my will and I do order that in the first place all my just debts and funeral chgs be paid and satisfied. Then I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Barbary Little all the rest of my estate only the land that is in Onslow County - I do hereby utterly disallow and revoke and disannul all and my other former testaments wills bequests and executives by me in any wise before this time named, witnessed, published, confirmed and confirmed this and no other to be my last will & testament. And testament in witness whereof - I have hereunto set my hand and seal the day and date above written signed sealed published pronounced and declared by the said Robert Little as his last will and testament in presence of us and now to conclude the whole I do appoint and ordain John Davison Esq to this my last will and testament given under my hand and seal Test William Farris Joseph Parks
