 Equally divided between her and her children. Item 4th
 I give to my son Edward Jones one dollar. Also
 The Ballance of my property not all ready disposed
 of after paying my just debts out of the same
 shall be sold and equally divided between my
 wife Sarah Jones, Emma Jones, Edna Smith, Anthony
 Jones, Jones Lewis and Edward Jones the sons
 Haywood and Marshall and my Little son Frederick
 Jones and Nancy Jones. I do further constitute and
 appoint my son Edward Jones and Levi Scovron
 Executors to this my last will and Testament. In
 witness whereof I do publish this my last will
 and Testament, July the 30th day A.D. 1830. Signed
 Sealed and declared in the presence of us Thomas Hill Jr
 James Grimes.

 Belonging therunto. Further I do hereby nominate
 and appoint my trusty friends Wright Smith and
 William Whitfield Executors to this my last will
 and Testament, hereby making null and void
 former wills and Testaments by me made and
 this only to be my last will and Testament
 hereby ratifying and confirming the same in
 witness I hereby and hereto set my hand and
 fixed my seal the day and year first written
