seven hundred and seventy six A.D. I Richard Williams of Bullington  
being very sick and weak in body but of perfect mind and memory  
thankes almighty god for the same and calling to mind the Mortality  
of my body and knowinge that its is Apparent for all men now to  
die. do make and Ordaine this my last will and testamant therin  
is to say principally and first of all to give and record my  
Soul to the hands of God that good it aileth for my body to  
recomand it to the Earth to be buried in a Christian Burial  
decent manner at the desposition of my Executors nothing doubting  
but at the general resurrection I shall receive the same  
again by the Mighty power of God and as touching such  
foreyld Estate wherewith it hath pleased god to blesse  
me with in this life I give devise and dispare of the same  
in maner and form following. this is to say.

I give to my dearely beloued wife Lydia Williams one Negroe  
man named Jeech likewise one horse bridle and saddle and  
six head of Cattle and feather bed and furniture one Negroe wench  
named Asney Jane Deoches four Dozans Eight platters one dozen  
of Spoons and likewise one Negroe girl and after her death to  
my leauing Joshua Daugther

Item - I give to my loving Cousin Joshua Daugther the plantation  
wheron I now bin with three hundred acres of land also a  
priest Mill and after my just debts and funeral charges the  
reminge part of my estate to be equally divided betwix my  
loving wife and Joshua Daugther. Give it to her and his his  
forever Also a pessell of land wheron William Wiggs is  
now living containing one hundred and fifty acres more or  
less I leaveth after my death to be sold to pay out of my  
estate as shall be required

likewise cause to make ordain my loving wife and beloved  
Daugther my only sole Executrix of this my last will and testamant  
and do hereby entirely disallow & revoke all former  
disnall & every former testament Wills and Legacys  
Bequests and Executors by one in any wayes before this  
time named Wills and legacys testifying and  
confirmin this and no other to be my last will and testamant  
In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and

I Robert Williams of the County of Mecklenburg  
in the State of North Carolina being advanced in age but of  
perfect mind disposing mind and memory and recollecting  
the uncertainty of this life do make this my last will and  
testament in manner following first I most earnestly  
recommend my soul to Almighty God hoping by his grace through  
the merits of Jesus Christ and at my departure my body to be  
decency buried at the discretion of my Executors hereinbefore  
named Next I give and bequeath unto my beloved wife  
Mary Williams my negro woman Bess and my Negro Woman  
Marry to be and her his forever. my will and command  
Also that my wife Mary Williams do continue on my plantation  
where I now live and have the use of it together with all  
of my Negroe that is not killed and given away on that  
shall remain from time to time not divided off and  
the rest of my movable property that I have on the plantation  
and all the provisions that I leave and my stock for  
the use and purpose of breeding and shewing my younger  
children during her natural life or widowhood and if  
she should marry them she is to be no longer possessor  
of any of my property leaving the said Negroe that I  
have just above named and given to her and her children  
and furniture and a good horse and saddle  
my self and bequeath to my son Francis Williams my  
Negro man Danie to him and his forever

West I give and bequeath to my daughter Mary George my  
Negro woman Tullah and her children to whom her heirs  
go to ever West I give and bequeath to my daughter Sarah  
Pruden my Negro woman Hanah and her children  
to her and her heirs forever.

West I give and bequeath unto my four youngest Sons  
Blancy Williams Branch Williams Harper Williams and  
James Williams all the lands that I possess on this County  
and in your County to be Equally divided between  
them or the sum of £1000.

My will and desire is also that my four youngest Sons  
Robert Williams Blancy Williams Branch Williams  
Harper Williams and James Williams have a Negro man  
a piece land app to them out of my stock of Negroes as  
they seem to be ays of twenty one years or there about  
for them.

My will and desire is also that my four daughters now  
living with me Piggy Williams Sophia Williams  
Patience Williams and Rose Williams be made Equal  
in Negro property to my four Sons last named, that is  
to say each Daughter Equal to each Son so they come to  
egy. My will and desire is also that my four youngest  
Sons Blancy, Branch, Harper and James, and my four  
daughters last named Piggy, Sophia, Patience and Rose  
have land of them all, a Horse and bed and furniture  
apiece then my will is after all my children have had  
this portion of a proportion to what is intended in  
the foregoing part of my will that the whole of the remainder  
part of my estate to be equally divided amongst the  
whole of my children.

And lastly I entitiate and appoint my wife Mary Willis  
and my Sons Francis Williams and Robert Williams  
Executor and Executrix of this my last Will and Testament  
Henry Matlaway and did also say all other executors  
Will by me made few weeks before my death to  
set my hand and seal this 22<sup>nd</sup> day of August 1810  
Signed sealed and delivered by the last will &

and Cours of Corn and all my working tools and at  
her death then all the余 movable to be sold and  
Equally divided among all my heirs forever.

Item I give and bequeath unto son Benjamin forty  
Shillings which I leave in the hand of my son William  
to pay him.

Item I give bequeath unto my son Meekel one hundred  
fifty acres of Land it being the land he now lives on  
Item I give and bequeath unto my son James two  
hundred acres of land lying on a branch called  
French Nut

one hundred acres of land it being the
