 three two year old, one bed and furniture to her
 sole use and disposal. Likewise it is my desire
 that if the negr wench Mary should have any
 more children for my beloved daughter Sallah Pumpmy
 to have ye first live child she brings and
 the rest of her increase to be divided betwixt my
 two sons John and Jesse Pumpmy. Also I give
 and bequeath to my two sons John and Jesse
 two Hundred and fifty acres of land belonging
 to the plantation to be equally divided. Also I give
 and bequeath unto my three youngest children
 John Salla and Jesse Pumpmy three cows and
 calves a piece. Also I give to my son John
 Pumpmy my gun and Riding. Also one pater
 dish one pater basin and 2 plates. Also I give
 unto my daughter Sallah Pumpmy one feather

bed and furniture one pater dish one basin
 and two plates also I give to my son Jesse
 Pumpmy one pater dish one basin and
 two plates. Likewise I do constitute and ordain
 my wife Anne Pumpmy and James Collins
 the sole Executors and Executor of this my
