 in thervants moving, and my wife give the said
 Patience two years schooling and after my wife
 decease my desire is that my sister Anne Boyell
 have the Negro wench called Teller. I give and
 bequeath to my wife Jane all my Property, except
 what I have given to others at her decease, after
 paying all my just debts and funeral expensur.
 I hereby make and Ordain my worthy friends
 Abraham Meltin Sr and Jesse Moltin Executors of
 this my last Will and Testament. In witness whereof
 the said Thomas Jamigan have to this my last will
 and Testament set my hand and seal the day and
